


At our November meeting, the Executive Committee discussed and decided to move the Change of Watch

# **EDUCATION OFFICER** P/C EDWARD H. REISS, SN-IN

The education program is in full The October and November swing. America's Boating Course each had 11 students. On-the-water training was a big success and very much appreciated by students (see p. 9). My goal is to slowly integrate more boat handling features into these outings.



To date our squadron has 55 members who have not taken the SEAMANSHIP course. This course will be taught by Lt Bob Belliveau, SN, starting on 1 Dec. 2014. He is anxious to pass on his decades of safe boating knowledge. Please let me know of your interest. The SEAMANSHIP course goes into depth on topics such as: Before You Go; How to Maneuver a Boat, single or twin screw; Docking; Situations while Underway; Anchoring and Mooring; your favorite Marlinspike; and much more. This class will also have an option for on-the-water training. This course can benefit skippers as well as passengers.

On the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> of December is a seminar on How to Use a Chart and GPS taught by P/C Jim Olmes, SN, and Cdr Carl Thieme, SN. Great chance to understand and use reliable, up-to-date paper charts as well as their electronic counterparts. Again, let me know your interest.

A new opportunity for MISPS is the use of a *computer* controlled boat simulator. This system consists of three screens showing the bow, port and starboard views, a steering wheel, throttle, gear shift and trim tabs. There are ten different situations you can practice without penalty of damaging a boat. Even if you run aground the simulated boat will just slow down and proceed back to deep water. MISPS will have the simulator from the 5<sup>th</sup> to the 8<sup>th</sup> of February. No cost! Let me know when during those days you would like to use the system. It seemed to me when I used it at the District 22 Conference that about 30 minutes would be a reasonable time to demonstrate your skills doing all ten situations. First come, first scheduled.

The complete education schedule for the courses and seminars is on our web page and on page 17 of The Eagle's Eye. Please check which topics you would like to attend or what other subjects are of interest. If you are interested in something please let me know early so I can order the needed student manuals.

In the meantime, strive to get educated, go boating and be safe.



#### **SAFETY OFFICER** LT JACK WALSH, N

Murphy was a Boater! No one expects to go boating and to encounter adverse conditions and emergencies, but adverse conditions and emergencies happen when you least expect them. In spite of the best planning and preparation, you will at some point encounter unexpected bad weather, restricted visi-



bility, or unpleasant situations such as running out of fuel, grounding, or needing to be towed. As Murphy's Law dictates when things go wrong they will do so at the worst possible time. Unfortunately, emergency situations or changes in weather are facts of life. If conditions are dangerous or you must work on deck, use a tether and jack line. While underway, do not allow passengers to stand in small boats or sit on foredecks, gunwales, engine boxes, seat backs, or transoms. Deck-gripping shoes are the best footwear; bare feet have very poor traction.

Fire on a boat is a serious matter. On a boat, there is nowhere to go except into the water. Most fires are preventable. Stay aware and immediately correct any condition that may cause a fire. Close all hatches before fueling; ground your fuel line nozzle against the fill pipe to eliminate static sparks. Check the bilge frequently. The bilge, lowest point in the vessel, is the collection place for spilled liquids, flammable material and fumes. Keep it clean and free of fumes. Store dinghy fuel and propane so they have plenty of ventilation; it is best to store them topside. Regularly check your fuel system for leaks and inspect electrical wiring. Repair any bare wires or loose electrical connections to prevent a spark from igniting fuel vapors. If you carry charcoal on your boat be careful; if allowed to get damp, it can ignite from spontaneous combustion. In case of fire, your first considerations must be persons on board. Since there is so much flammable material on a boat, your first thought should be the safety of the passengers and crew. If the fire is near engines and fuel, you should consider getting off the boat with PFDs as soon as possible.

Follow these steps if fire breaks: Immediately place a Mayday call to the Coast Guard on VHF Channel 16 or using Digital Selective Calling (DSC). You can always notify the Coast Guard later if a Mayday situation no longer exists. Turn off all fuel supplies: engine, galley stove, heaters. Disconnect all sources of electrical power. Immediately get the people off your boat and as far away as possible in case of an explosion. (Continued on page 19)





It started with a boat briefing pre-departure checklist by each of the captains on the squadron member's boats. We took the class out to the junction buoy at the mouth of Marco River to show them the many ATONs out there. The marker changes were stressed as we went under the Jolley Bridge and the folks were quizzed about it. We talked about safety, identified stand-on vs. give-way, use of appropriate sound signal situations as examples occurred; pointed out the restricted area by the bird sanctuary islands, the "no wake" area after the Jolley Bridge, the measured mile, how the water is deeper on the outside of the curves as we proceeded through the mangroves to Goodland, and pointed out the numerous shallow places outside the channel. turned around at Coon Key due to the windy weather and found an area for demonstrating the setting and retrieving of the anchor. # Civic and Humanitarian Service USPS D/20 & D/22 participate

This year's trip to El Salvador (Global Village) was again sponsored by Thrivent Financial and Habitat for Humanity. I felt so rewarded by being able to help our fellow man last year that this year I brought my granddaughters Brittany Trenker (25) and Taylor Tedesco (18) along for this experience. My cousin Dale Arnold, P from Waukegan Squadron, IL (D/20) and his wife Andy were the leaders for our group of twenty. Our project was to work on building homes at 3 sites. Everything is done by hand, as the only power tool was a saw to cut block. We sifted sand separating fine for mixing mezcla (mortar) and stones to be used later for sidewalks. Chispa (cement with small gravel) was mixed right on the ground and used to fill the concrete blocks. Buckets filled with cement and long branch handles were used for tamping down the sand before concrete (many wheelbarrows full) floors were poured. We used the mezcla for between the blocks which were laid perfectly by string lines and a plumb by the master mason. The mason has a helper and someone from the family must have "sweat equity" doing their approximately 450-sq. ft. home. One man in our group on his first trip remarked, "I've never worked so hard in my life", but he was satisfied he could help.

The families were so warm, friendly and happy that we were there. Lunch and snacks were prepared by the village co-op and brought by women after a 15 minute walk to the site with bundles carried on their head. We enjoyed the local cuisine and fresh fruit for snacks. The view from our work site was most picturesque with the volcanic mountains (small steam vents could be seen) and the geothermal plant using heat from lava for energy.

Time for fun also. One afternoon we took a tour of a coffee factory ... what a long process! Workers sometimes carry 100 lbs. sacks of coffee on their backs to pile up in warehouse to ceiling ... \$6.00 per day. I really appreciate that cup of "joe" now. Last day was at a fantastic resort with pools, animals to see, kayaks, restaurants and the Pacific Ocean. Baby turtles were released. Very hard work, but wonderful camaraderie with locals, workers and our volunteers made for a gratifying endeavor. My granddaughters, blisters and all, want to go again next year!
