

In Memory of C. Robert & Margaret Meyer Founding members of MISPS



Past Commander C. Robert Meyer, AP, 97, of Naples died on 14 May. He was born in Hanover, KS and attended the College of Emporia, where he met his future wife, Peggy Cole. C. R. was a graduate of the U. of Kansas and a Navy Veteran of World War II. He retired as general partner of the Kansas City office of accounting firm Ernst & Young in 1974; a past president of the Missouri Society of CPA's, and a member of the Council of the American Institute of CPA's.

The Meyers moved to Marco Island in 1978, where he served as treasurer of Marco YMCA, the Cruise Club and United Church of Marco. In 1978 he was a founding member of Marco Island Sail & Power Squadron (MISPS) and served as the first Secretary. C. Robert was Commander of MISPS 1981-1982.

Margaret "Peggy" Meyer, 98 died 18 May, surviving her husband by only 4 days. She was born in Chanute, KS 18 April 1917 and attended College of Emporia. In Marco, Peggy was active in the Women's Club, Cruise Club, and MISPS. As a member of the United Church of Marco, Peggy volunteered at the church's Bargain Basket; she also was a volunteer at the Naples Community Hospital.

C. R. and Peggy will be very much missed by our squadron. We send our sincere condolences to his son and wife, Bob and Marci Meyer of Marco, 2 grand-children and 4 great grandchildren.

We are also members of Marco Island Chamber of Commerce, participated in their Business Expo and sponsored the first Night Beach Clean-up. MISPS was a sponsor in the 50th Anniversary Celebration of Marco Island (courtesy of an anonymous donor) and now will be a sponsor in the upcoming Commemorative 50-Year Anniversary Book of the Marco Island Fire Rescue Department.

Thanks to all our members who promote MISPS, our good works, and USPS. Our squadron is becoming a household name here on Marco.

Safe Boating Week "Wear It" campaign organized by PR Chair Lt Gene Burson, S was a terrific success. (See pp. 12-13).

Our squadron's VSC team has completed 221 vessel safety checks to date. This puts us third of the 18 squadrons in District 22 behind Crystal River (1140) and Cape Coral (308). About half of our 15-member team is up north for the summer,



but most have taken forms and VSC decals with them to do local safety checks.

About two dozen of our members showed up on 26 May for the MISPS sponsored Marco Island's First Night Beach Cleanup held from 1800 to 2000. Starting at South Beach, we picked up lots of plastic, straws, paper and metal scrap leaving the beach cleaner and getting good PR for MISPS. Many of us, wearing bright yellow tee shirts provided for the event by M. I.'s Beach Advisory Committee, had our pictures in the local papers.

Cdr Peggy Reiss, JN-IN, P/C Ted Reiss, SN-IN and Lt/C Bill Hughes, JN met with Commander Keith Wohltman and Doug Bartlett of the Coast Guard Auxiliary to start planning for a Flare Demonstration to be held on 2 February 2016 at the Marco Island Yacht Club. There are a lot of arrangements to be made. In the meantime, if anybody has expired flares that they would like to contribute for the demonstration, please give them to Bill Hughes or Ted Reiss for storage.

Co-op Charting Committee met under Chair P/C Carl Thieme, SN and divided into smaller teams for surveying ATONs. On 4 June, a 3-person team of D/1/Lt Andrea Battaglia SN, Bryan Mordecai, AP and Tom Morr, S surveyed by boat 40 ATONS on the south side of Marco. Photographs were taken of ATONS and GPS coordinates were recorded. At least 16 of the 40 were damaged or missing. The photos and data were submitted to District 22 Co-op Charting Chair Stf/C Jim Strothers, SN. On 18 June, Andrea made a presentation regarding the ATONs to the Marco Island Waterways Committee; hopefully repairs will be made soon.



Naut Guilty

This past weekend a 29-foot power boat with thirteen people aboard attempted to anchor at a popular anchorage off Spectacle Island in Boston Harbor. During the failed anchorage a 19-year-old female passenger jumped over the side to retrieve a




seat cushion that had blown into the water. As she struggled to climb back aboard, the vessels propeller cut off her arm above the elbow. Panicked distress signals were issued from the boats radio; however, because the calls failed to identify the location or the nature of the distress, response was unnecessarily delayed. When 45-foot response Coast Guard and the local rescue vessels arrived on the scene, a tourniquet was applied to the arm above the amputation to control bleeding; the patient was taken to Massachusetts General Hospital where she was described as in "stable condition". The Boston Globe describes that a "frantic and ultimately vain search for the severed arm continued until dark".

Minutes before the distress signals, the boat had been seen swerving through the remnants of the Long Island Bridge, maneuvering the wrong way through the passage and traveling at excessive speed. The owner of the boat, named the "Naut Guilty" a 33-year-old Boston attorney whose website described his specialty: the defense of drunken driving, motor vehicle, and drug cases, etc. He was arrested on charges of operating under the influence and reckless operation of a vessel.

Unfortunately, I did not make up the above scenario. This is taken from news accounts in today's paper. It reminds me of the pictures that used to be posted where the question was asked, how many animals can be seen in this picture or some similar question. These were visual mind puzzles, the challenge was to find images hidden within the picture. In the case of the "Naut Guilty" the challenge is to find the multiple number of safety errors which led to this tragic end to a day on the water.




Reynolds, AP at the helm and Lt/C Rhonda McAuliffe-Gloodt, AP.

First Aid / CPR / AED Class

For adults think: 30 Compressions, 2 inches, 2 breaths! That was the theme for the CPR part of class with 14 MISPS students at the Marco Island Fire Station given by Captain Chris Crossan and FF Sergio Deleon, Paramedic. Each person practiced on the adult and baby mannequins ... one and two and three, etc. or to rhythm of "Staying Alive" song. The AED was demonstrated; we practiced placing pads on mannequins at the verbal direction from the AED. A number of first aid scenarios (heat stroke, broken limb, etc.) were demonstrated as well as the Heimlich Maneuver. At the end of the session, Heart Association cards were received. These free classes are offered at the Fire Station on Saturdays ... give them a call!












16 - 22 May ... Safe Boating Week

World record broken with 10,917 participants worldwide (Previous record was 6,973)! The largest participation in State of FL was on Marco held 16 May at Rose Marina with 95 participants & several dogs all with life jackets. This year our squadron accepted the responsibility to rally the safe boating organizations of our area into a unified voice to wear a life jacket when on the water. There was an official sign-up sheet prepared by MISPS, a unit of the United States Power Squadrons®, as well as free coffee, a life jacket and site donated by the Rose Marina (Dan High manager); 15% discounts by Rose Marina were also given out. A life jacket and three hooded sun protective shirts (\$60 each) were donated by John Burton of the Naples based Snikwah Company (Life Jacket value \$140. each).

This "Wear It "campaign is making boaters aware that they, their families and friends, should always wear a life jacket whenever on the water. Eighty four percent (84%) of all boating accidental deaths on the water have been when people are not wearing a life jacket. We thank our Publicity Chair Lt Gene Burson, S for coordinating this worthwhile project and all the attendees and organizations that made this event a success!
