

#### SAFETY OFFICER 1/LT Jack Walsh, N

#### First Aid Kit

Every vessel should have some type of First Aid kit. This may be very rudimentary or quite complex and complete depending on factors such as the size and use of the vessel and the level of training and skill of the personnel aboard. Here are some



suggestions for what to include in your Nautical First Aid Kit.

You should include gauze pads, in various sizes. There are now gauzes pads for cuts and nosebleeds which are impregnated with a material that accelerates clotting. These are great for people who take aspirin or other medications that prolong bleeding time. These products are designed for minor injuries only and not for bleeding from an artery. Follow directions on the packages, especially regarding getting medical attention if the bleeding doesn't stop quickly. Kerlix or kling type bandaging material and bandage scissors should be included, as well as First aid tape, ace bandages, band aids, and Steri strips. Be sure to have available sunscreen and provisions for shade such as towels, ponchos, blankets or a travel umbrella. Sealable plastic bags such as big Ziplocs bags can be used to discard contaminated material. An antiseptic such as Betadine should be included. This iodine compound is a more effective disinfectant than alcohol. Ice is safer to use than commercial cold packs which can leak and cause a chemical burn. Other items which may be included include bottled drinking water, paper towels, nonlatex gloves, CPR masks, hand sanitizer, liquid Benadryl, chewable baby aspirin and Triple antibiotic or Neosporin ointment.







### Co-op Charting—Report to City of Marco Island Waterways Committee



P/C Andrea Battaglia, SN giving report;

On 18 June, report to the Waterways Advisory Committee was given by



Our squadron is conducting an ongoing operation to identify the damaged, missing, off-station, and poorly maintained ATONS as part of our squadron Cooperative Charting program. This includes photos of the markers and handheld GPS coordinates no more than a couple feet from the ATON (Aids to Navigation).

On 4 June 2015, 3 of us surveyed ATONS on the south side of Marco and I have a copy for your committee. (Copies given to Waterways Chairman Jim Timmerman) Not noted is the fact there used to be a "C" lighted midchannel marker, which made boating much safer at night. It was almost in direct line with ATON Daymarker 5 coming into Caxambas Pass. I believe after "C" was not present, ATON 5 was made a lighted marker. Now Marker 5 is missing altogether. We do need at least one lighted marker coming into Caxambas Pass.

The MISPS co-op charting committee has divided into groups to survey the other zones around Marco Island and will do this project over the summer.

Another comment; Marker #1 Beyond the Picket Fence was relocated about 2005. The current location cannot be seen coming from Coon Key Light, past Red # 4 back in towards Caxambas Pass area "Beyond the Picket Fence". [Chart # L 01]

Please note, in my opinion, the sign (green square) on the beach at Cape Romano — should change from green to black & white. (see photo) At night a boater flashing a light searching for markers could mistake it for a green ATON.

The committee asked a number of questions and was appreciative in respect to our reporting.

#### Recreational Boating Accidents – 2014

In 2014, the Coast Guard counted 4,064 incidents that involved 610 deaths, 2,678 injuries and just about \$39 million dollars of destruction to property as a consequence of recreational yachting/boating accidents.

#### **Statistics**

The fatal accident scale were 5.2 deaths per 100,000 registered recreational vessels. This toll represents a 10.6% rise from last year's fatal accident rate of 4.7 deaths per 100,000 recreational vessels. As compared to 2013, the quantity of boating accidents amplified 0.05%, the number of fatalities increased 8.9%, and the number of non-fatal injuries increased 2.2%. Where reason of death was identified, 78% of the fatal boating accident fatalities drowned. Of those drowning fatalities with reported life jacket use, 84% were not dressed in a life jacket. Where training was known, 23% of the deaths occurred on vessels where the operator had received boater safety education. Only 12% percent of deaths happened on vessels where the operator had traditional nationally-approved boating safety education such as the Marco Island Sail and Power Squadron.

Eight out of every 10 boaters who drowned were using boats less than 21 feet in length. Operator distraction, unacceptable lookout, operator experience, too much speed, and alcohol consumption rank as the top 5 principal contributing factors in boating accidents.

Alcohol abuse is the foremost known contributing cause in fatal boating accidents; where the principal cause was known, it was listed as the chief factor in 21% of deaths. Twelve kids under age 13 lost their lives while boating in 2014. Seven children or about 58% died from drowning. Four children or 57% of those who did drown were wearing a coast guard approved life jacket; two were not required to by state law. Where data was known, the most common types of vessels involved in reported accidents were open motorboats (47%), personal watercraft (17%), and cabin motorboats (15%). Where statistics were known, the vessel types with the greatest percentage of deaths were open power boats (47%), canoes (13%), and kayaks (10%). The 11,804,002 leisure vessels registered by the states in 2014 represent a 1.7% decrease from 2013 when 12,013,496 recreational boats were registered.

#### Conclusion

Most boating accidents occurred on smaller power boats less than 21 feet operated by operators with little or no boating training.

#### On the radio . . .

It was a lively program with lots of info and discussion of safe boating education. It was emphasized that boaters should always wear life jackets (suspender type very comfortable) when boating. The Sundowners

This is a document that gives all information as to your boat, where you are going, who is going with you, when you will be leaving, and perhaps most importantly, when you are expected to return. Give this document to a

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
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
