







Lt Gene Burson, S continues to get the local newspapers to run public service announcements of MISPS events, our educational program; also articles on boating. In the area of Public Relations, nine MISPS members just attended a "meet and greet" function at a local restaurant sponsored by the Marco Chamber of Commerce. The event was attended by leaders of other civic organizations, business owners, and some city officials.

We have had a few more Vessel Safety Checks last month, bringing our total to 228. The VSC team has two requests: 1) If you have not had your boat checked, please contact Lt Tom Ryan, P (389-6585) to schedule a vessel safety check. And, 2) If you are interested in joining the team, please call Tom. It's fun and offers an opportunity to meet other boaters and provide an important safety service.

The Flare Demonstration is scheduled for 2 Feb. at the Marco Island Yacht Club. We met with the Coast Guard Auxiliary, our co-sponsor, on 28 Sept. to firm up plans for this event. It is important to know how many "out-of-date" flares we can obtain for this event, so please send an email to me stating how many and what kind you can contribute.

Our squadron has purchased an AED (Automatic External Defribulator) to be kept in our condo. The plan is to train our members in the use of this life-saving device to be used in case of an emergency. We will start training with the members who recently took a CPR course and will use the video that comes with the equipment.

D/1st/Lt Andrea Battaglia, SN gave another presentation to the Marco Island Waterways Advisory Committee on 17 September. Discussion focused on the differences in the data bases of the County and that of MISPS Waterway Sign© program data.

This month we have had a lot of rain and lighting! We had to cancel our cruise and picnic to Keewaydin because of the weather. On 15 August 2015 a Naples, FL charter boat captain, Shane Chaplin was hit by lightning. The Captain was sailing the 53 foot 'Sweet Liberty' catamaran back



to the Naples dock after taking 16 passengers sight seeing for two hours. The weather was looking bad and he told the passengers to take cover inside the catamaran. As he entered the entrance to Gordon Pass at 1500 lightning hit the mast, traveling to the helm and knocking the Captain unconscious. The 16 passengers were not injured and stayed calm. Unfortunately the 'Sweet Liberty' had lost power and was stranded. A 911 call brought the police and fire boat. The 'Sweet Liberty' was towed to the dock where it was met by an ambulance to take the Captain to the hospital. He was awake and talking at the time. The Captain is doing well and everyone thinks it is a miracle that he is still alive! It was a good thing the Captain was aware of the weather and told the passengers to take cover. He was also heading back to the dock which made the rescue quicker and cell phones were in range.

The above event could have been much worse. I highly recommend members become more knowledgeable about weather by taking our Weather class offered in January (page 20); I will be the Weather instructor.

The Marco Island Sail & Power Squadron will be donating a Christmas tree to the Art League fundraiser again this year. We have bragging rights for having the first Christmas tree sold at the first Art League Christmas tree sale. Our second Christmas tree promises to be better than last year's tree with help from our members. I am looking for a full size white tree if any one has one they are not using any more. EDUCATION OFFICER P/C Edward Reiss, SN-IN

The ABC student manual has been revised. The new version will be used starting with the October class. It contains all of the previous info, plus additional information, corrects some topics and better presents some of the previous information, all aimed at helping students learn to be



safe boaters. Let your friends know we are ready to help them learn about safe boating.

The full education schedule is now on our web page and included in the *Eagle's Eye*. Instructors are anxious for you to register so let them know your interest. Or if you would like to be an instructor let me know.

Why take any of the courses or seminars? We each may have a different answer but some might be: to increase my understanding of safe boating, to learn new skills, to help solve emergency situations, to reinforce what I have forgotten, etc. One goal may be to attain the certification of an Inland Navigator. The IN requires a member to take several classroom courses and seminars and to demonstrate your small boat operating skills on the water.

Courses for the IN are Seamanship, Weather, Engine Maintenance and Marine Electronics. Seminars are How to Use a Chart (or Piloting), Using a GPS (or new Piloting) and VHF Radio. The OTW portion includes about 25 skills such as: pivot turn, emergency stop, docking and undocking, slalom course in forward and reverse, anchoring and other normal boat operations. How can we help you reach the IN goal? MISPS has two certifiers for the IN credential. I can provide additional information.

Congratulations to Lt/C Bill Hughes, JN and Dennis Trego, N who have obtained the designation of "Educational Proficiently". Educational Proficiency is awarded to anyone who has achieved the grade level of at least Advanced Piloting and completed at least three Elective Courses. Their grade insignia will be shown with the Educational Proficiency bar below it.

At the Fall D22 Conference I will attend the two round table seminars on education expecting to learn about new information in the various courses and seminars. (cont.)

Trailering Safety

Problems with the boat trailer can ruin your plans and leave you broken down on the side of the road instead of enjoying a day on the water. This is especially true if you trailer infrequently or for the first trip of the year when trailer has been sitting unused



for a number of months. A frozen or overheated wheel bearing, a flat tire without a spare or a jack or a broken spring can ruin your day.

Before you go; check to see that all the trailer's nuts are tightened. Check the hitch and ball on the tow vehicle, and trailer to be sure they're in place, tight and of the correct size. Lubricate the hitch and grease the ball. Adjust the position of the boat on the trailer to keep the proper tongue weight. You can use a bathroom scale and a box to measure tongue weight of smaller trailers. The recommended range is 7 to 10% of the total tow weight. Too little and the towed load will tend to be unstable - swaving from side to side. Use safety chains that are strong enough to support the trailer's tongue weight. Instead of S-hooks, use hooks with safety latches to hook chains to the hitch Ensure that the running lights are operational. Check the tires, including the spare, for defects and proper inflation. Grease, repack or replace the wheel bearings as necessary. If the trailer has brakes, have them serviced if necessary. Check the security of the boat tie-downs. If you trailer only once or twice a year, make a list of items to check so you don't overlook anything.

It is a good time to take a trial run to an empty parking lot to practice your handling and backing skills. While underway, after traveling a few miles, stop and check the wheel bearings to be sure they're not overheating. As Ben Franklin observed, an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure.

Also I plan to explore the latest version of the Boat Virtual Trainer in expectation of scheduling an opportunity to bring the system to Marco this winter. Stay tuned.

So while you are waiting for your favorite classes to begin, go boating and have fun.



Royal Observatory in Greenwich, England, the home of the Prime Meridian of the world

P/C Tippy Cavanagh, SN and her husband John recently returned from a tour of England, Scotland and Wales. While in London, they went by boat on the River Thames to visit the Royal Observatory in Greenwich. The Observatory is best known as the location of the Prime Meridian and is situated high on a hill in Greenwich Park overlooking the River Thames. This is the Prime Meridian of the world, longitude 000 degrees 00 minutes 00 seconds. This, as you know from your celestial navigation courses, is the basis of the time zone system. The Meridian Building at the Royal Observatory houses the Airy transit telescope and the Prime Meridian is marked on the pavement of the courtyard. You can actually straddle the line having one foot in the Western Hemisphere and the other in the Eastern. Tippy even bought socks celebrating the occasion. The buildings include a museum of astronomical and navigational tools, including John Harrison's H4 chronometer and his three earlier marine timekeepers. Tippy says, "As a teacher of celestial navigation, it was really exciting to visit the Observatory and to actually stand on the Prime Meridian!"


