I am particularly proud and pleased to report that our Squadron Education Officer Ted Reiss received the District 22 Award for Excellence in Teaching! This award, also known as the Chapman Award, goes to the individual who is deemed to be the best in the entire District. Ted will be District 22's nominee for the National Teaching Award for the year 2015. He will be in competition with District nominees throughout the country. The winner will be announced at the National Conference, in Orlando in February 2016. Congratulations Ted for a great job!

The Conference gave us a chance to meet with the other squadrons in the District and exchange ideas of what works and what is less effective in making the squadron better for the membership. 
In Memoriam

In Gloucester, Massachusetts there is a well-known monument called the Fisherman's Memorial which borrows a biblical passage for its dedication; Psalm 107:23-24: "They that go down to the sea in ships that do business in great waters". It is appropriate for us



to remember the thirty-three Merchant Mariners who were lost when the 790 foot cargo ship the El Faro, sailing out of Jacksonville, Florida on what was a routine weekly trip to San Juan, Puerto Rico, was presumably sunk with the loss of all hands when it encountered Hurricane Joaquin on October 1st. The captain had reported a hull breach, a blown scuttle, and taking on water when the ship apparently lost engine power and foundered in the path of the hurricane. According to the Safety Board, the Coast Guard picked up three alarms going off on the ship about the same time. Although the captain had reported in an email to a company safety officer that he intended to take a course around the storm, data relayed by these alarms placed the ship's last known position about 20 miles from the edge of Hurricane Joaquin. The ship has not yet been recovered and the inquiries, lawsuits and recriminations are just beginning. The sinking was especially tragic for the Massachusetts Maritime Academy in Bourne, and the Maine Maritime Academy in Castine. Of the thirty-three seamen lost, 7 including the captain, were graduates of these two Maritime institutions. The Maine Maritime graduates lost were: Michael Davidson of Windham, a 1988 MMA graduate, who was captain of the cargo vessel; other crew members included Danielle Randolph, 34, of Rockland, a 2005 Maine Maritime graduate, the second mate; Michael Holland, 25, of Wilton, a 2012 Maine Maritime graduate; Dylan Meklin, 23, who graduated from Rockland High School in 2010 and from Maine Maritime only this May and Mitchell Kuflik, Class of 2011. Jeffrey Mathias, a Kingston, Massachusetts resident, was on board the El Faro, as was Keith Griffin, both were graduates of Massachusetts Maritime Academy.

Let us keep in our memory and in our prayers all the Mariners lost in the *El Faro* tragedy as well as their families.

September seems not only to be the "hottest"







I hope they all can "catch a big one" on the Marco Reef sites!

Congratulations team! Thirty-six 500-ton reefs have been deployed! A little bit of history ... the business plan was finalized 4 June 2012. The project launch luncheon was 20 September 2012. The BP grant, totaling 1.3 million, was awarded 12 November 2012. The Community Foundation Fund agreements, providing donated funds for the REEF project to the three local governments, was completed 19 March 2014. The final version of the 'teaser' video was completed February 2014. The USACOE permit applications were submitted November 2013. Approved USACOE permits were received Dec. 2014. The Paradise REEF Celebration was in January 2015 and the first reef deployment was 9 January 2015, and the final reef on this project was deployed on 9 October 2015.

The remaining phase of this project is to deploy the artificial reef modules and concrete benches. These will be placed in the vicinity of the existing reefs. The reef coordinates, provided by the boat captain upon deployment, are attached.


