# EDUCATION OFFICER P/C Edward Reiss, SN-IN

Are you ready for 2016? Instructors are geared up to make 2016 our best and most informative year. As I think back on my own education I remember my first experiences with the Public course soon followed by Seamanship. I thought boating was supposed to be fun so why are they



telling me about all the hazards? After a while realization occurred. They were preparing me for the what ifs and how to deal safely with each situation not with any high probability that my boat would be on fire or a person would suddenly be overboard or gas would be in the bilge or on and on. My next thoughts are that I have forgotten many of the fine points on many subjects and things change over time. Simple examples, remember when we changed the name from life jackets to personal flotation devices (PFDs) and then from Type I to Coastal and Type II to Near Coastal life jackets. How about when Loran changed to Global Positioning System and then to chart plotters and now Automatic Identification System superimposed with radar images on touch screen displays augmented with arrival time at a destination and time and location of closest approach to another vessel.

Starting with Electronic Navigation on 4 January and Weather on 14 January our courses and seminars are designed to fill in the gaps and expand your comfort zone. If you don't see a course of interest on the web page or herein let me know. Also please let me know which courses or seminars you plan to attend as early as possible so I can order the student material. Go boating and be safe.

multi-purpose Class ABC extinguishers for use on boats because there's plenty of wood, fabric, fiberglass, fuel and electrical components to fuel a fire on a boat. When it comes to portable extinguishers accessibility it is of paramount importance and in case of a fire response time is critical. The best extinguisher in the world is worthless if it's buried in the back of a closet or behind stacks of gear. Extinguishers should be located in readily accessible, low-profile locations when exposed, or immediately inside the door when placed in a cabinet or closet.

#### Fighting a boat fire

At the first sign of fire have all persons don their life jackets and have someone immediately place a distress call on VHF channel 16. At the same time, display all of your visual distress signals. It is important to get out a distress call early as in a short time



you and your crew may be too busy to stop and put out a distress call or the fire may destroy the wiring to the electronic means of communicating preventing a distress call. It is also important to don life jackets immediately as a fire on board can quickly get to the point that access to life jackets is blocked. Even if it seems initially that the fire is minor perhaps simply a curtain or something smoldering in the galley it is always wise to err on the side of caution as a fire on board can quickly grow out of control. When all hands have their life jackets on, move them to the farthest area, away from the fire. Then turn the boat to keep the flames from blowing back towards the unaffected area. You should know the proper type of fire extinguisher to use for gasoline, alcohol, or electrical fires. You should also know the proper way to discharge the extinguisher, and how to aim it at the fire base and to hit it with sweeping short bursts. The Code of Federal Regulations (46 CFR 25) requires USCG approved marinetype fire extinguishers on any vessel with enclosed living spaces, permanently installed fuel tanks or an inboard engine(s). An outboard powered boat with a closed compartment for storage of fuel or portable fuel tanks also comes under this regulation. The minimum number of extinguishers required is determined by the length of the vessel. Extinguishers are classed by what kind of fires they are intended to put out: (A) solids, (B) liquids and (C) electrical fires. There are two sizes of dry chemical (B) extinguishers depending on the amount of dry chemical contained. Size B-1 contains a minimum of 2 lbs. of dry chemical and size B-II a minimum of 10 lbs. of dry chemical. At the minimum a marine-type handportable fire extinguisher is a Coast Guard-approved Class B-I or B-II extinguisher as the majority of boat fires involve gasoline. Extinguishers are available that can cover two or all three types of fires, and the American Boat and Yacht Council (ABYC) recommends (continued on left)





Walter recommended that we add members MMSI numbers to our roster information. He gave more information than written here. Cdr Reiss thanked Walter, the 50/50 was drawn, and the meeting was adjourned.




