


I think we have a very energetic squadron with both social and civic activities. Makes me proud to be a MISPS member!

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#### **EDUCATION OFFICER** P/C Edward Reiss, SN-IN

I am happy to announce that 1/Lt John Maciolek, P volunteered for and was appointed to the position of Assistant Squadron Educational Officer. Thanks John. His new role will get him involved with the America's Boating Course as well as other aspects of our programs.

The Virtual Trainer is up and running. John and I are playing with the trainer to learn how to maximize your time and fun. System consists of a steering wheel, control panel with single or dual throttles and the display projected from our overhead projector to display either a view from the helm or an aerial view. System can be run for single engine boats or twin engine boats. Scenarios are set in various locations around the world, i.e. San Francisco, New York, Europe etc. to allow practice in driving, docking, obstacle avoidance, rules of the road, and navigation. There is even a feature to show how much damage you might cause and how the boat will respond to the throttles as the boat takes on water (before sinking). Contact me to set up time for you to hone your skills.

Education schedule for the Fall and Winter is in the draft stage. Plan is to offer several sessions on a request only basis. These are VHF Radio and specific manufacturer GPS/Chart Plotter sessions for Garmin, Raymarine and Lowrance devices in a member's boat. Two new seminars relate to Cruise Planning and Weather. Dropped from last year are Rules of the Road and Mariner's Compass. We would like to schedule courses in Electrical Systems (basic wiring on a boat) and Engine Maintenance, however we need an instructor for each and a specific interest from members wanting to attend each course. Who is interested? Please let me know by mid-July.

If you have an interest in another aspect of boating let me know so we can prepare a seminar on that topic. Hope to hear from you.

### SAFETY OFFICER Lt Jay Fernandes

#### Safe boat handling & fun on the water

Safe Boat Handling is second nature to many members of the MISPS. Our power squadron has cruised extensively and as a result acquired a wealth of knowledge and experience. We learn firsthand by continually making decisions while transiting from place to place, sometimes long distances. Re-



calling from past experiences, we apply our knowledge to new situations which undoubtedly always arise. The sea is a powerful force. Being unprepared can lead to damaged property and even injury.

When you are cruising around SW Florida, moderate wind and seas are common. It's a tricky place for gunk -holing, a favorite pastime. Recently, our power squadron cruised to Whitehorse Key. Several boats left Marco Island and transited several miles southeast. When we arrived at 11am the breeze was 8-10 knots out of the North East. The wind soon shifted more Northerly and continued to build. A nice thing about islands is that they always provide a lee. We found a calm and safe anchorage on the leeward side of a sandy spit on the North end of Whitehorse Key. Each vessel was safely secured fore and aft to prevent side to side drift and to compensate for the tide. Having a stern anchor prevented damage to trim tabs and transducers. The bow anchor on the beach made it easy to pull the boat closer and safely debark with all the required equipment to have a comfortable picnic in the shade. It was a beautiful day. What could be better?

Returning to Marco from Whitehorse was more challenging due to brisk wind on the nose. During any transit, each Skipper must consider several factors to assure a safe return. Among them are wind speed and direction, set and drift, boat speed and displacement, draft, proximity to navigational hazards, tidal height, and vessel traffic. The boats made it back safely without a hitch due to safe and responsible boat handling techniques derived from years of experience and acquired knowledge.

The MISPS is devoted to education. Our courses are widely recognized as an excellent way to learn basics boating techniques and advanced subjects such as piloting and navigation.


# Captain's Meeting

In communities that have an event, such as this, it has been proven that people are more likely to wear a life jacket when they are on the water. 80% of the deaths on water are preventable if they would have been wearing a life jacket. Last year we registered 95 people and one dog with life jackets and Marco Island was number one having held the largest event of this kind in FL. 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




