That is followed by an On-The-Water event, use of the Virtual Vessel Trainer and a presentation on how to use a computer navigation program for charting and cruising.

Whenever changes in dates, times or topics are made (and there are some from last month) they are posted on the web page. So please contact me or check the latest website. Several new seminars are offered this season: How to Predict Weather and a Cruise Planning Roundtable.

A recent check of the squadron members education proficiency revealed over 60 members have not yet taken the SEAMANSHIP course! Nick Rago, AP and Rick Kelso, AP are looking for some of you to register for their course which starts on February 6th – plenty of time to arrange your schedule. Let them know of your interest. This course covers boat handling, how to deal with emergencies and much more information on overall boating safety and background. Course is good for both the Skipper and the First Mate.

At our October dinner meeting the Virtual Vessel Trainer will be available for all to see or use before the business meeting or after the formal speaker. Boat choices range from a jet ski to cruise liners (think Titanic) with single and double engine options. We can also change the weather from calm to stormy or day to night.

Instructors are ready to hear from you. In the meantime let's go boating and be safe.





SAFETY OFFICER Lt Jay Fernandes

Hurricane season is upon us again and we are all watching weather maps to be ready and prepared. Much of the knowledge and information we acquire is accumulated from years of experience and listening to others. Most of us have assets at risk which are exposed to wind and sea. Our MISPS members have been challenged by the forces of Mother



Nature and prepared in advance on numerous occasions. There is not a better resource when you need ideas on how to better prepare for severe storms than listening to others who have successfully weathered them. Wouldn't it be helpful to solicit input from our members? Let's hear about the storms you remember and what happened. What would you have done differently? What should we do to better prepare our properties for such events. Give us your input. Send your anecdote, story, advice to jayseafern@gmail.com. I will compile and distribute.

The first week in September we had a close call with Hurricane Hermine. Many of us had to anticipate an unknown path and take necessary precautions to protect our property. Depending on our confidence we can either leave the boat in the water or have it removed. If the boat is small enough we simply put it on our trailer and park it in a safe place. Once the boat is out of the water make sure the drain plug is removed so the boat doesn't fill with water which can cause severe damage to the boat and trailer.

Leaving the vessel in the water is an option but also has greater risk. Typically, Coast Guard Cutters and Navy ships leave Port when a storm is imminent because heavy winds and extreme tides and surges are too dangerous. When in Port double up bow and stern lines, also spring lines must be adjusted to compensate for extreme tides. All lines must have fair leads so they don't get tangled or chafed. Frequently it is not your vessel which is the problem but someone else who hasn't been as cautious and their boat causes damage to others. Double check the automatic bilge pump. Remember, if a hurricane had an attitude it might be: "Whatever isn't tied down is mine for the taking and if I can pry it loose it, wasn't tied down." "Semper Paratus".





City Commissions New Police Boat

On 13 September, the City of Marco's new police boat was commissioned and launched at Rose Marina. Twelve MISPS members braved the unsettled weather to demonstrate their support for the police and recognition of our cooperative mutual efforts at safe and responsible boating. The boat is a 220 Bahia Ranger with nice big "Police" in reflective letters on the side. Extensive modifications were made by Ranger with consultation from Dan High, Mgr. Rose Marina and the Police Dept., Marine Div. to fit their needs. City Manager Hernstadt expressed pleasure with this city purchase. After a brief but impressive blessing the boat was launched and Rev. Nguyen donned a life jacket to join the officers for the initial test ride. The Ranger, when not in service, will be on the lift adjacent to the ramp in Caxambas Park at the south end of Marco. From this point, she can respond to situations in the 10,000 islands as well as support other first responders in near-





The 2016 Governing Board Meeting, held in Pittsburgh, concluded on Saturday, 27 August. By all accounts it was a successful meeting. Besides the department and committee meetings available on Thursday, there were a number of seminars offered on Friday. These included but were not limited to: Squadron Growth – Finding What Works, Instructor Development, and SERAT Does It All on the Water. The official meeting attendance on Saturday was 405. These changes involve a whole new way to document and file the information. In addition to changes in filing reports there are other issues that impact United States Power Squadron members.

Since these changes were just presented and issues were discussed it will take some time to put it all together. Missing ATON Markers

About two months ago I reported to the City of Marco Island that ATON marker 5 (circled above on the left) and 7 (circled on right) were missing coming into Caxambas Pass. They forwarded the information to the proper contact at Collier County. Again, on 5 Sept. I observed that those ATONs remain missing. I attended the City Council meeting on 6 Sept. and presented the above diagram and again reported the missing ATONs. I stressed, for safety sake, the importance of having a lighted ATON coming into the pass, especially at night. Right now the markers lead a boater straight towards rip-rap (rocks) and docks. At one time, a lighted "C" channel marker and lighted green ATON 5 were present.
