






were unrecoverable. I now have an external hard drive back-up.



SAFETY OFFICER Lt Jay Fernandes

Do you want to know how to never run aground? The humorous answer is do not cruise around Marco Island. A lot of truth is spoken in jest. We love cruising around Marco Island and on almost any day, it is easy to find a beautiful secluded sandy beach where the fish are jumping everywhere, the water is warm and the breezes are balmy.



Our squadron cruises together all around the area, as far south as Everglades City and as far North as Fort Myers. There are way too many beautiful destinations to mention them all, but Keewaydin Island, Cape Romano Island, Whitehorse Key, Panther Key and Tiger Key are some great spots. We cruise together in a group, which is like the old buddy system for safety and helps prevent running aground with an experienced skipper leading the way.

Several of our members have transited by boat from their residences in the North to Marco Island. On the journey south we've negotiated many narrow channels and tricky inlets. From my experience, I'd say that Marco Island and the Ten Thousand Islands present an environment as difficult to navigate as any. The water is very shallow and the currents are strong. The sandbars are ever changing due to strong wind and current. A small tropical storm can easily create a new sand shoal.

Understanding the difference between tide and current is imperative for safe boat handling. Remember, tide is vertical change; current is horizontal flow. A skipper may be able to cross over a sand shoal at high tide but upon return if the tide has gone out the same shoal may not be passable. Tides create current as massive quantities of water move into and out of vast estuaries every 12 hours. The current flows fastest during max ebb and max flood and a rushing current can quickly move a vessel out of the channel. To prevent grounding, throttle back, check depth and GPS. If the current has moved your vessel into the shallows turn sharply back into deeper water where it is safe.

Smooth sailing!

A few years ago, we took our usual "short-cut" on the outside of Kice Island going to Cape Romano for a picnic. Going was fine, but coming home coming into Caxambas pass, water was too shallow due to changes from recent tropical storm. This area changes many times after storms, so be aware! Andy B & Bryan





Everyone had fun trying to play golf, enjoyed the luncheon immensely, but could not believe not a one of us won anything.




