A question was recently raised asking just how educated is our squadron. The breakout of how many members have attained the various grades follows: Senior Navigator 11, Junior Navigator 12, Advanced Pilot 13, Pilot 11 and Seaman 25. That leaves over 70 with no grade! Homeland Security Seminar

District 22 held 2 seminars on Homeland Security, one "north" and the one closest to our squadron was on 19 Nov. in Cape Coral. Six of our members attended (see the Executive Officer report on page 5) and will report back to the squadron in the future.

Our anchor is one of the most heavily used devices on the boat. There are so many variables involved with proper anchoring it would be impossible to come up with a foolproof method that would work under all circumstances. Contending with all the variables makes anchoring a boat an art not a science. Some of



the variables that must be considered are boat size and weight, type of bottom, wind direction, wind speed, water depth, current, tide, sea or wave height and more. Anchoring provides a safe but temporary method to keep a boat in one place so the skipper and crew can rest and focus on other things. But beware, boats frequently drag their anchor. This can be caused by inadequate scope or a shift in wind or current. Anchor dragging is such a common threat that on larger vessels a person is assigned to stand anchor watch at all times.

Cruising around Marco Island, the water is generally shallow, the bottom sandy and the currents strong. The winds are variable and can build to considerable strength on any given day. Anchoring under these circumstances is challenging but if done properly makes our time on the water comfortable and relaxing. On smaller boats, the anchor gear is stowed. On larger vessels this is not an option. The anchor, chain and rode are too heavy and a windlass is required.

After placing the anchor gear near the bow where it will be deployed it is wise to immediately attach the tail end of the rode to a cleat. Run the anchor rode in a way that will anticipate a fair lead directly through the chock leading to the cleat. Lower the anchor and feed out the rode but be ready because sometimes a gust of wind or strong current can catch the boat and the anchor rode can suddenly start to feed out very rapidly and get away from your grip. Stand clear and be careful because when the anchor sets it can put extreme tension on the line. When this happens you'll be thankful you cleated the tail end.

All of us in our squadron use our anchors frequently when we cruise around the area. Once we are safely anchored we can focus on activities involving rest and relaxation.

MISPS Dinner Meeting

The "annual" 13 November dinner meeting was held at the Marco Island Yacht Club. The social hour was held downstairs in the boaters longue with lots of room to mingle with other members. Our evenings speaker, Fire Rescue Chief Mike Murphy brought 2 of his EMT staff who offered free blood pressure screenings to our members. An excellent dinner of either chicken piccata or stuffed pork chops was served upstairs in the dining room for 52 members. Bridge reports were given and since this is our official annual meeting, the secretary read and cast the ballot to elect the slate of nominees watch year 2017-18. After dinner, Chief Murphy first discussed the recommendation for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (COPCN), a certificate that would allow Marco Island to provide its own emergency medical services (EMS) paramedic and transport services. FL state statute requires that a municipality obtain a COPCN via the county to provide EMS services. At this time, Marco Island and Collier County EMS work together in an interlocal agreement. Next emphasis was on "call before you fall"; M.I. offers services that can prevent falls related injuries in the home. One out of 3 adults fall each year, 50% of seniors who are injured from a fall die within one year, falling once increases risk of future falls. (cont. p.13)




Pancake Breakfast—Benefit **M. I. Fire Rescue Foundation**







BRAINSTORMING MEETING


