Two new seminars are offered in January. On 5 January is the WEATHER seminar, led by Lt/C Rhonda Gloodt AP, a short look at the fundamental weather systems,



early warning signs, the components creating our weather and how to predict what might happen in the near future and forecasts on the internet. The second new seminar is the CRUISE PLANNING seminar or round table led by P/C Erin Olmes JN and P/C Jim Olmes SN set for 21 January. This discussion is for members who would like to extend their enjoyment from day-boating to over-night boating. It focuses on the planning and preparation necessary for safe, enjoyable, extended cruises on both inland and coastal waters via sail or powerboat, owned or chartered.

Other courses for January are: Piloting, Advanced Piloting, Junior Navigation, and Weather. Other seminars are How to use a Chart and How to use a GPS. February course offering is Seamanship, the first full course after the America's Boating Course and might be perfect for those of you wanting more information to keep you comfortable and safe while boating.

The December America's Boating Course had 22 students. Lt Gene Burson AP has done a marvelous job with public relations and advertising to get the word out. Students are already signing up for the Charting, GPS and Partner in Command seminars as well as an on-the-water event and use of the virtual trainer.

Regarding the virtual trainer, I plan to have it available from 10 am to 8 pm on 6 January. If you would like to schedule a time slot give me a call. Need encouragement on docking? How about just driving a boat around obstacles? I will also plan dates for February and March.

The Digital Media Library now has over 15 scenarios. Check them out and let me know your thoughts.

## SAFETY OFFICER Lt Jay Fernandes

Writing about experiences actually helps me exercise more caution for the next time I go exploring the backcountry, which is often. Recently we cruised to Whitehorse Key via the inside route, during an extreme low tide. This factor changed the experience considerably; there were exposed oyster bars everywhere. I've been exploring



Marco Island and the ten thousand islands for several years and my knowledge of the area is still very limited. On my way to Whitehorse Key, we saw sandbars I'd never seen before. We travelled at idle forward much of the time. Due to the extremely low tide I navigated primarily by using my depth finder because I had to keep the boat within a small area where the depth was 2 to 3 feet in the channel. Wandering outside the channel the depth went to 1 foot or less. The trip was actually exciting, as seen from a completely different perspective. However, we were relieved once we found our way to a channel taking us outside into deeper water. If it was not for the GPS we would have been lost because deep inside those mangroves everything looks the same and at midday it is hard to know which way is west to the Gulf.

Understanding the tide is imperative for safe boat handling around this area. Remember, tide is vertical change. A skipper may be able to cross over a sand shoal at high tide, but upon return if the tide has gone out the same shoal may not be passable. When we travel around the mangroves at half tide or better we can confidently cruise on plane if we have good GPS tracks. But beware, those GPS tracks shouldn't be relied on as foolproof especially when the tide is low.

An incoming tide brings in fish from the Gulf as massive quantities of water move into vast estuaries every 12 hours. Fishing trips into the backcountry on an incoming tide gives some peace of mind knowing the water depth will slowly increase as we explore deeper up the rivers that feed fresh water into the estuaries. On a trip far up one of those meandering rivers a passenger once told me it was better than Disney World. Every trip into the ten thousand Islands is an adventure.

Smooth sailing!




