

Students continue to learn! America's Boating Course had twenty students in January. Piloting and Junior Navigation courses are underway (not aground or tied up). GPS, Charting and Weather seminars enriched both members and non-members.



So what other opportunities are available? First is **SEAMANSHIP**.

This course being taught by Lt Rick Kelso, AP and Nick Rago, AP; it focuses on boat safety topics in much more detail than the America's Boating Course. Hint, there are more than two knots to master. Rick and Nick will show you how along with much more relevant information.

Next are short two-hour seminars:

**Partner in Command** (11 February) – aimed at couples, what can a partner do when the all-knowing captain can no longer assume that role. This seminar may include on-the-water guidance in your boat.

**Paddle Smart** (15March) – the fundamentals of getting in and out of a kayak, how to propel it and necessary equipment.

How to Use a Chart and GPS (28 & 29 March)

- the basics of what information is on a chart either on paper or a chart plotter, how to determine your location and that of a destination and how to go from here to there.

VHF & VHF/DSC Radios – Features, How to Hook Up and How to Use.

The Vessel Trainer is up and running and is not just for the beginner. With boats from a jet ski to the Titanic there must be something you have not yet captained. Forty-five minute time slots are available for 3 February from 1230 till 2000 or 7 February from 1000 till 2000. Contact me to reserve a slot.

Is there another topic you would like to learn about? If so let me know so we can put together a seminar. My schedule for the future has one change.

For your information, I was nominated to become the District 22 Administrative Officer starting in April. I will continue as Squadron Educational Officer for another year with the help of 1/Lt John Maciolek, AP our Assistant Educational Officer.

### SAFETY OFFICER Lt Jay Fernandes

There are several people in our lives who have contributed to our knowledge of the sea. Our boating experience may have started by going out in a boat with a friend or family member. However it started, we became hooked and at some point wanted our own boat. We either had to equip the boat or it came equipped. Every piece of



equipment had inventors. Navigational equipment was of utmost importance. Who were the people that developed this stuff we all take for granted? One such person who you may or may not have heard of is, Nathaniel Bowditch, born in 1773. His eulogy should make anyone curious about his life.

"In his death, a public, a national, a human benefactor has departed. Not this community, nor our country only, but the whole world has reason to do honor to his memory. When the voice of Eulogy shall be still, when the tar of Sorrow shall cease to flow, no monument will be needed to keep alive his memory among men; but as long as ships shall sail, the needle point to North and the stars go through their wonted courses in the heavens, the name of Dr. Bowditch will be revered as one who helped his fellow-men in a time of need, who was and is a guide to them over the pathless ocean and of one who forwarded the great interests of mankind."

Dr. Bowditch was a seaman from Salem, MA. but above all a self-taught brilliant mathematician. His work with navigation, specifically longitude by lunar observations was ground breaking. His mathematical skills, in my mind, must have been those of a genius. His contribution to navigation, shipping and commerce are immeasurable. All our sophisticated electronic navigational devices developed by engineers standing on the shoulders of engineers are based partly on his measurements and algorithms.

The "New American Practical Navigator", originally published by Edmund Blunt in 1802, stayed in the Bowditch and Blunt family until the government bought the copyright in 1867. To this day, the U.S. government has published 52 editions that have come to be known simply by its original authors name "Bowditch."

### THANKS, P/C JOHN KREHBIEL, SN

Long time MISPS member P/C John Krehbiel, SN, age 93, has now moved back to Michigan to be closer to his family. John taught the USPS weather course for many years, giving students a glimpse into his vast experience as a meteorologist during WW II. The original hurricane hunters were Army Airforce flyers, one of those being 1/Lt. John Krehbiel. He



was a weather observer assigned to the first squadron to report weather conditions that could hinder flight operations of Guam and Saipan. Typhoons were one of the conditions to be located and reported and are larger and more powerful than hurricanes. John was one of those pioneers that helped bring new technology that later was able to construct weather models and use real-time meteorological data. John and his crew were in the second aircraft in his squadron of four planes to fly directly into the unknown of a typhoon. The aircraft they flew was a B24 Liberator, like those used in bombing runs in the Pacific theater, but bombs were removed and in their place were installed bladder fuel tanks. This provided extra range to traverse the storm and gave more time in the actual storm. John was the meteorologist on the second flight to deliberately fly into a known typhoon. found that flying between 8,000-10,00 feet altitude put them between cloud layers and gave them a chance to go around the thunderstorms. John describes a ride beyond anything most airline passengers or even pilots could experience. At times, he said, he had all he could do to just hang on and keep from getting hurt. It was at those first debriefings where the Chief of Navy and Army Meteorologists realized the significance of their flights. John was Commander of MISPS 1995-1996. We thank John for all his service to our squadron and wish him all the best for the future. (Source: Marco Eagle, 5 February 2007)





First of all for 2016 ... we did great! Six of our members examined over 20 boats each, with Rudi Landwaard, JN leading the pack with 45 vessel safety checks! Five more members completed more than 10 safety checks. In total we did 251 boats, around the same as we did last year. The down side is that we inspired the rest of the squadrons in our district to compete with us and we ended up tying for 3rd place. I noticed that the other squadrons significantly increased their number of vessel examiners. There is a definite correlation between the number of examiners and the number of boats completed. I also believe there is a definite correlation between the number of boats inspected and the level of safety consciousness.

This year a few of our team members have stepped down or moved. So one of our focuses will be on recruiting new examiners. I would ask all of you to include this as part of our goal this year for supporting our squadron. If interested, we'll show you how. There is a text book, and we go out with the new examiners to assist in their first five vessel safety checks. Give me a call!




