



#### EDUCATION OFFICER P/C Edward Reiss, SN-IN

Education program continues to increase skills making members safer boaters. Piloting, Junior Navigation and Seamanship are almost over. Seminars on Charting, Partner in Command, Weather and GPS had great attendance. Paddle Smart seminar (15 March), one more Charting/GPS seminar (28 & 29 March) and America Boating



Course (starting 1 March) will finish the posted Winter schedule. In addition, the Vessel Trainer was used by students after the January ABC class and as part of the Partner in Command Seminar. An On-The-Water exercise was held for 18 students showing them practical, real life examples of the Marco waterways, navigation aids, radio communications, boat handling, rafting up and stand-on/give-way situations.

What's next? How about an **Instructor Development** course in April? We need more certified instructors to share the load and vary the topics available. The last two ABC classes had 18 and 22 students. A good number joined our squadron with an expectation to learn more both in the classroom and on the water. The ID course addresses how to more effectively present information along with theory on how we learn. That alone could benefit you without ever going into a classroom again. Please seriously think about getting an ID certification. Let me know your interest or questions. If we can get 4 to 6 members interested I can schedule the course around your schedules with a start date in early April so, please respond by 15 March. For next year, there is a need for another person in the Education Department since I will assume to role of the District 22 Administrative Officer on 1 April. I will continue as SEO for the coming year and would like to offer insight into the role of the department.

On-the-water training is one of the topics students ask about. That may be the single reason students seek us out. It is hard for me to relay how pleased I am when a student becomes more confident about handling their boat. It only takes a short time behind the wheel with guidance from a more experienced person to build up their confidence. We all have made mistakes, will make more mistakes and all of us continue to learn. I'd like to develop a cadre to help our fellow members. Any volunteers? The Vessel trainer is available; next scheduled day for playing is 21 March. Email or call me to reserve a time between 1600 and 2100.



#### **SAFETY OFFICER Lt Jay Fernandes**

"Marine navigation blends both science and art. A good navigator constantly thinks strategically, operationally and tactically. He plans each voyage carefully. As it proceeds, he gathers navigational information from a variety of sources, evaluates this information, and determines his ship's position.



He then compares that position with his voyage plan, his operational commitments and his pre-determined "dead reckoning" position. A good navigator anticipates dangerous situations well before they arise and always stays "ahead of the vessel." He is ready for navigational emergencies at any time. He is increasingly a manager of a variety of resources: electronic, mechanical and human. Navigation methods and techniques vary with the type of vessel, the conditions, and the navigator's experience. The navigator uses the methods and techniques best suited to the vessel, its equipment, and conditions at hand.

Some important elements of successful navigation cannot be acquired from any book or instructor. The science of navigation can be taught, but the art of navigation must be developed from experience. (Bowditch, chapter 1 Section 100)

Whenever we discover a new cruising area, like the Ten Thousand Islands, it is important to consider all the above. One of the best resources for gaining experience is the MISPS. Many of our members have extensive cruising experience, not just here but also the Great Lakes and inland waterways, Eastern Atlantic Seaboard, Bahamas and Caribbean.

Many of our local waterways are well marked. For boat owners new to the area start with a simple cruise plan. Learn the local ATONs and channels before exploring unmarked areas. Use the resources of the MISPS to gain experience by cruising with a group. For new boaters, try taking a simple short cruise around Marco Island at high tide and then the same cruise at low tide. Experience the difference.

Also, as stated above, always monitor weather conditions. Observe the tremendous difference between a stiff breeze on the nose compared to a following sea downwind. Debarking to leeward with a following sea may seem gentle and comfortable but on return entirely different as the wind may have
