





### EDUCATIONAL OFFICER D/Lt/C Ted Reiss, SN-CN

Who has the "Right of Way" on the Marco River? Do you remember the answer from any of our courses or seminars? If not, give me a call. If not, do you plan to operate a vessel around Marco? If not, what course should you sign up for?



The MISPS education program for December through March began

with 10 people passing the America's Boating Course in October, followed by 12 people attending the How to use a Chart and GPS seminars, 12 people have starting the Seamanship course with eight members and four non-members, and people are already signing up for the December and January ABC courses. If you missed Seamanship it is scheduled again for Feb.

One of the squadron's goals is for members to learn about the safe and practical operation of their vessels. What better way than to attend classes and/or seminars and take advantage of our classroom vessel trainer and/or instruction in on-the-water training. Presently we have 13 instructors willing to help you increase your skills.

The squadron web site has the complete schedule BUT to urge you on in December we have an ABC course, a two hour Anchoring seminar, a 4 session Instructor Development (ID) course and a 3 hour Operations Training (OT3) seminar. ID will help us address our need for more certified instructors. OT3 gives you an overview of the entire United States Power Squadron from the national level to the local squadrons appropriate for newer members as well as veterans. 
In 2018 in addition to courses and seminars we hold every year we have several courses and seminars not conducted in a few years - Engine Maintenance course, Marine Electrical Systems course and Hurricane Preparedness seminar. Check them out. Sign up early. In the meantime, go boating, be safe and have fun.





### SAFETY OFFICER Lt Ed Bauer

Most of us have fully assessed the damage wrought by Irma to our properties, however, our local waterways continue to represent unknown dangers. While most of the sunken vessels have been removed, debris remains in the water. The USCGAUX reports shifting of many of the shoals, moving 15 to 20 feet. Of course, many



ATONS and other markers have been moved, damaged or destroyed.

The Coast Guard Auxiliary recently advised that owners of large vessels should try channels first in smaller craft, and not to assume that areas that were previously navigable can still be transited safely. One spot that came in for special mention was the entrance to Collier Creek off of the Marco River, where strong currents, shallow water and a no-wake zone have long made for a difficult passage. At the condos right at the mouth of the inlet, not only the docks, but the seawall and the entire point of land have vanished, swept away by Irma's waves and wind. In general, boaters should swing wide through turns, as the deep water follows the outside of bends, while sandbars form on the inside of the curves.

Also, around Cape Romano, boaters are advised not to hug the point and that transit is very hard except at slack water. The Cape Romano dome home lost one of its domes, which now lurks beneath the water next to the still remaining structures The waters between Cape Romano and Coon Key Light present significant hazards and scouting is suggested.

Caxambas Pass had seen significant shoaling before Irma, and it has reportedly become worse since. The two outer entrance ATONS are missing. The shoal between Marco Island and Dickman Point on Kice has migrated landward, requiring local knowledge and operator vigilance. The "picket fence," the long string of closely spaced markers guiding mariners from Caxambas around Horrs Island is another area requiring special caution.

Lt/C Gene Burson, AP reports the biggest problem on the water is that there is not a coordinated group to report on problems or correct the problems. The commanders group that is just getting started on Marco will try to address these problems at its next meeting.






