

Now is a good time to have your vessel inspected. In 2017, the Marco Island Sail and Power Squadron conducted free vessel safety inspections on more than 300 boats. Wow! What a contribution to safe boating in our community. Time to do it again.



With the beautiful weather Marco Islanders enjoy in the middle of 'Season' more of us will be on the water with family and friends. That means this is the right time to make sure your lights, sound devices and radio are working properly, your flares and fire extinguishers are within their expiration dates, your personal flotation devices, lines, anchor(s) are in good condition and that your vessel is outfitted with the required equipment and notices. It is also useful to remind yourself to make sure your vessel registration and insurance is up to date. These and other parts of the safety check will give you the peace of mind of knowing you are a prepared and responsible boater.

In 2017, the MISPS Bridge made it an objective to seek to inspect the boat(s) of every member. Please do your part and contact Lt. John Salotto (703/864-5528, johnj.salotto@gmail.com) or Lt. Dan Marinelli, S (239/900-0299, gopackers1113@msn.com), our VSC Co-Chairs, to schedule your inspection. They will arrange for one of our 13 trained examiners to provide this free service.

Remember that local law enforcement officers can stop and inspect your vessel at any time you are on the water. Reduce the risk of a sanction if you are properly equipped and all is in good working order.

Now for a word of thanks. First of all, kudos to past Commander (and new Silver Trident) Rhonda Gloodt, for a job well done. With Irma, 2017 was a tough year and Rhonda provided the steady hand and good humor to help the MISPS get through the storm and its aftermath. SAFETY OFFICER Lt Ed Bauer

A friend recently returned from a visit on the east coast and recounted an interesting accident involving a boater and his new large pontoon boat. When docking, they entered their lift and remotely raised the lift to its proper elevation. As one passenger started moving about, the center of



gravity changed, and the boat levered backwards at a steep angle with the stern into the water and spilling some of the passengers and gear over the deck. The owner had previously marked on the dock where he thought he should position the boat based on the hull being centered on the lift. Unfortunately, he had not fully considered the significant weight of the engine and the cantilever effect of the bracket supporting the engine. Fortunately, passengers suffered only minor cuts and bruises.

Another friend recounted a situation last summer when he was repositioning his boat a short distance to his home from a nearby marina. He lost his steering control and had to anchor to avoid being blown onto the rocky coast. When he called Boat US for assistance they asked for his location; he responded with local landmarks but, as the operator was in some remote location not familiar with the locality she needed coordinates. Since the friend was travelling only a short distance, his GPS was not available. Fortunately, he remembered that the longitude / latitude coordinates were on his phone and the operator was able to dispatch a response boat. My coordinates can be found on both my SeaTow app as well as on the compass app. Can you find yours?

Have you had a PS member perform a Vessel Safety Check on your boat? Do you have boating friends or other condo owners who would appreciate this safety enhancement service?

Have you taken a CPR / First Aid Certification course recently?

Do you routinely assign someone as lookout or assistant skipper on your boat?

Have you taken a MISPS course this year that can enhance your boating skills? I recently attended a seminar on anchoring and one of the greatest benefits was to exchange ideas and experiences with the other boaters attending (including the best way to beach your boat- bow or stern first.).





White Horse Key Cruise and Picnic








First Aid Course at MIFD
