

National Safe Boating Week

May 19-25, 2018

National Safe Boating Week is May 19-25. Although boat safety is something that we should focus on all year, this week reminds us to pay particular attention to our mission of safe boating.

According to the National Safe Boating Council

- 80% of boat deaths are due to drowning
- 83% of victims were not wearing a life jacket
- 2/3 of drowning victims are good swimmers
- 77% deaths occurred on boats where the operator had no boating safety instruction
- Florida ranks first in the US in reported boating deaths (70) and reported boating accidents (684).

What can you do to make sure you aren't a statistic? First of all, make sure your boat has a current vessel safety inspection.

These free inspections will insure that your boat has key safety features like life vests, navigation lights, visual distress signals, sound producing devices, navigation rules, and fire extinguishers. Second, consider improving your boating skills by taking one of our education classes or seminars. Finally, join members of the Squadron on Monday, May 7 at 5:15 p.m. at the Marco City Hall to attend the Council meeting where we will receive the Safe Boating Week Proclamation. Wear your Power Squadron shirt and your life vest to the meeting.

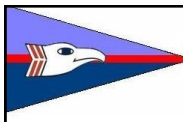

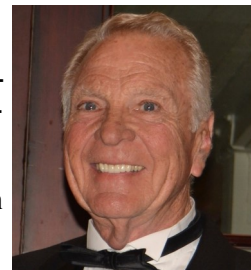

All members should come to City Hall at 5:15 pm on May 7th to receive the proclamation wearing their Power Squadron shirt and life jacket.



As a tribute to safe boating on Marco Island, we will be participating in a Wear IT! campaign event with the major boating organizations on Marco Island. The event will be held at the Marco Island Yacht Club on May 19th with everyone wearing their life jacket. More details will follow when we get closer to the date.

At the April membership meeting when members were asked to raise their hands if they had not had their boat inspected this year, I had to admit I was somewhat embarrassed that I had to raise my hand. First, I thought that I must have had it done late last year but remembered that the stickers were late. Then friends and family came to visit, so you put it off. I am scheduled now. This will make me get those new flares and fix my corroded light connection before the VSC examiner arrives.

At least once a year every boat owner should go through a check list of activities to insure their boat is sea worthy. I believe most people will have the engine serviced if necessary and probably have plenty of life jackets on their boat. Other things you may not think of are reviewing your insurance policy, inspecting your anchor and tie lines, updating your GPS software, inspecting your lift cables, and greasing your lift. Your neighbors will appreciate not knowing every time you are using your boat.

Owning a boat is a large responsibility and one we have sworn to maintain, operate legally, and assist others when possible.

Safe Boating. It's our cause and our passion.

The United States Power Squadrons (USPS) elected its first officers in New York in February, 1914 and was incorporated in 1915 for the purpose of educating vessel owners about the safe operation of their boats. In an article, founding Chief Commander Roger Upton put it this way: *"To my mind the organization can be of use to yachtsmen for three major reasons: first, improvement in navigating ability of power-boat owners; second, promotion of acquaintance and social intercourse by the power-boat owners; third, the fitting of power-boat owners to be of possible use to the Navy in time of war so that they might be received as volunteers should they so desire."* Our three-sided mission -- skill development, social connection and civic responsibility -- was born.



To be a tax-exempt entity, an organization must either be a charity or to fulfil some governmental purpose. The USPS and the Marco Island Sail and Power Squadron (MISPS) are 501(c) (3) organizations. We teach boat handling, navigation and boating rules and regulations to the community. When requested, our Vessel Safety Examiners perform free inspections to assure boat owners that their vessels are properly equipped and key safety equipment is in good working order. MISPS Co-Op Charting teams assist area governments maintain our waterways by providing information about the current condition of aids to navigation. As a boating club, MISPS events help members gain useful experience and knowledge of local waters from accomplished boaters. Oh, and we have fun!

The inspiration for the USPS occurred at the dawn of the age of power vessels as a 'club (for power boaters) within a club' at the Boston (sailing) Yacht Club. The rigor and dedication the early members brought to the training programs they developed was so compelling that over time the mission of the USPS broadened to encompass all types of vessels. The idea spread and a network of squadrons was formed.

This spring as we advocate for and celebrate safe boating, let's take a moment to thank our for-bearers for the foundation they created and think about how we can further spread their vision of competent, sociable and civically engaged 'yachtsmen.'

We are in a season of change. We have completed our spring curriculum with one exception (see weather below) and we have gone into planning mode for our 2018-2019 Education Program. We are in the process of transitioning our name from one that conjures up images of uniforms and organization to one of relaxed enjoyment and informality. We are even restructuring our courses to provide greater flexibility for the students. And, we are renaming some to more closely reflect the subject matter. In the midst of all these changes the one ingredient that remains constant is “boating safety”. Regardless of what we call the organization or how we restructure and rename the courses we continue to focus our education program toward teaching and improving boaters’ skills.

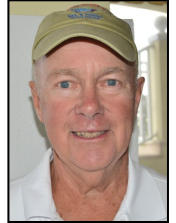


Our Fall offering of classes may look different and our Spring ’19 offering will certainly look different. Our Seamanship Course will be replaced by a reorganized version called “Boat Handling”. I am sure the name is a lot more meaningful to someone who is not familiar with the Power Squadron – which is the intent. The restructuring will also eliminate some redundancy that exists today between our “courses” and our “seminars”. For example, Boat Handling will include a section on “anchoring”. This section may be taken as part of the Boat Handling course or it may be taken separately as a Seminar, replacing our existing “anchoring” seminar. The full Boat handling course will be in six parts: Rules of the Road, Docking and Undocking, Boating with confidence, Anchoring, Emergencies on Board, Knots and Line Handling. Similarly, our other advanced courses will also undergo changes. The changes are being worked now and we expect the revised material to be available later this year. The plan is to provide the course material either in printed form or electronically.

Back to the present. *We are offering our last course of the season – Weather - beginning May 2. This seminar is an in depth 10-week course that will help boaters (or anyone) interpret and predict weather using a variety of techniques. Learn about standard computer and phone applications for describing and predicting weather patterns. Learn how to use the sky, clouds, wind direction, and temperature to predict weather conditions. The timing for this course is just perfect as we enter the predictably unpredictable weather of summer and hurricane season. For more information please contact P/C Rhonda Gloodt (239-450-7089). Also, any members who have already taken this course and would be interested in attending a session to help Rhonda, give a call.*

In recognition of May 19-25 being named Safe Boating Week, and with the help of P/C Peggy Reiss, JN, this column will focus on Kayak Safety as experienced in the SW Florida waters. First, start with having a vessel safety check (VSC) on your boat, an excellent opportunity to discuss paddling safety issues with the examiner.



The basics of paddle craft safety are similar to larger boats with some exceptions. A special, Coast Guard approved PFD for paddlers is more comfortable- wear it! If you are going into the sometime confusing backwaters, consider a hand-held GPS or even a cellphone with map / GPS App. Remember, your cellphone compass should include your Lat/Long coordinates. A whistle or other signaling device is essential and required by the Coast Guard.

Check the weather forecast for strong winds, thunderstorms, and tide changes. Prepare a float plan and advise someone where you are going and when you expect to return. Wear bright clothing as your low-profile boat may be difficult to spot by other boaters, particularly in busy channels such as between Capri and Keewaydin. Include visual distress signals in your boat. Don’t forget snack / energy bars and plenty of water and sunscreen.

Do you have an extra paddle? A chart of the waters? What about a line attached to the kayak in case you capsize, and the boat starts drifting away with wind or current? A waterproof first aid kit? Waterproof identification and contact information?

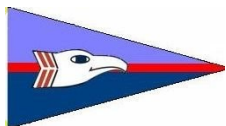
In cooler waters, be prepared for immersion with appropriate clothing or a wetsuit. If your boat is not self-draining, bring along a bailing device or bilge pump.

The next time you go on the water you might consider flipping the boat and practice reentering and dewatering.

If you have never paddled a kayak before, consider a two-hour guided tour of Rookery Bay for an up-close and personal experience of this irreplaceable national treasure. Paddle lazily through the shallows and mazelike mangrove tunnels while learning about your surroundings from an experienced guide and **natu-ralist**. <https://rookerybay.org> For additional kayak safety information take a Power Squadron class or contact the American Canoe Association at: <http://www.americancanoe.org/>

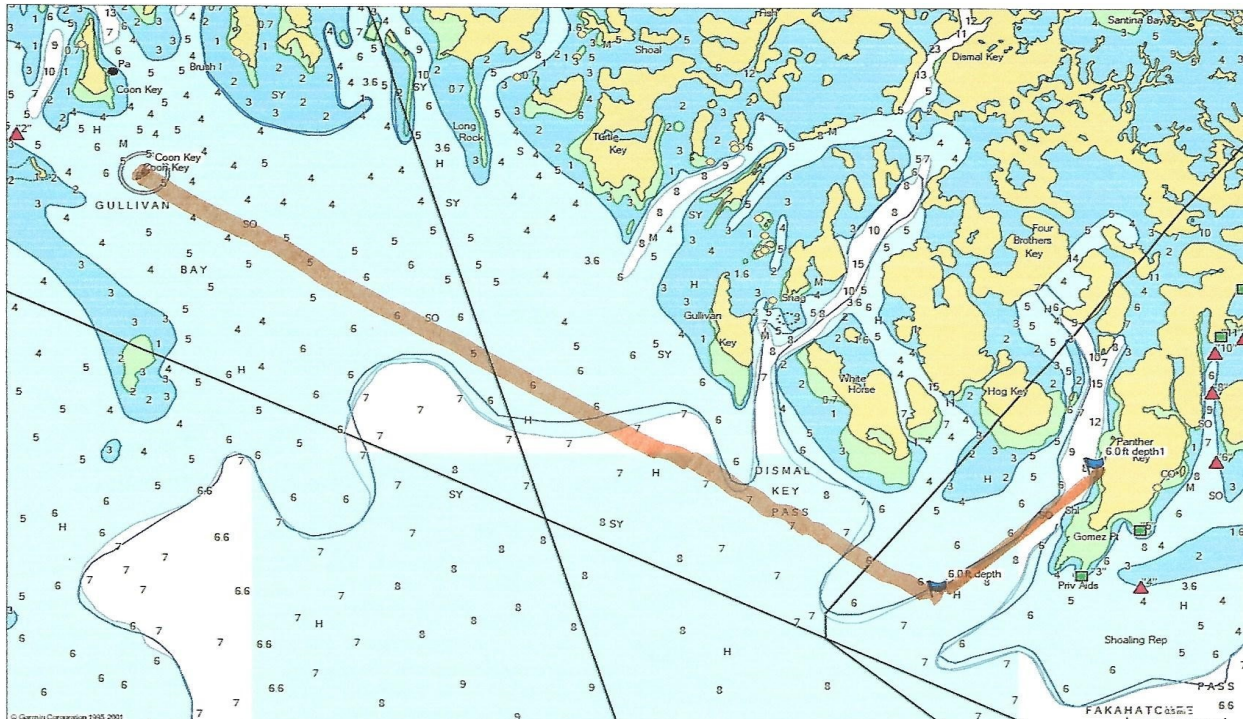

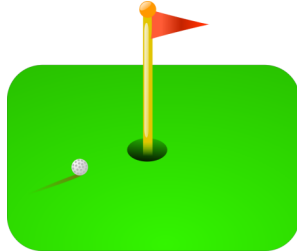

April General Meeting

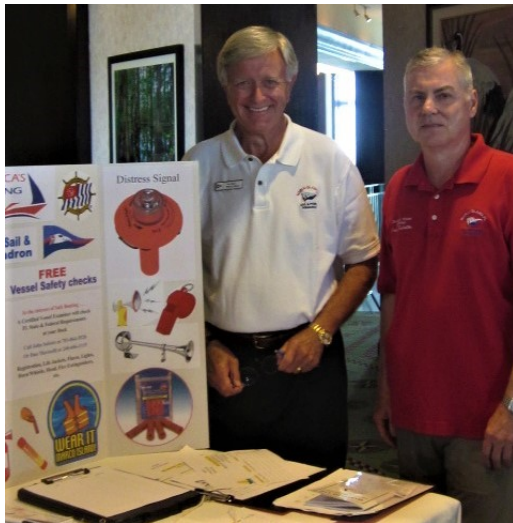

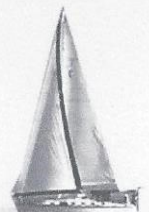

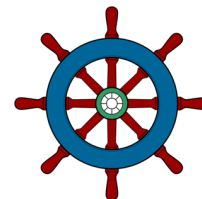
