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

What's in a brand? It is a representation of a thing, organization, product or service. Why do we care? Because the United States Power Squadrons, of which the Marco Island Sail and Power Squadron is a part, is in the midst of re-branding to up-date and refresh what it means to be a member.

Why? Because the world of boating has changed in the 100+ years since USPS was founded. As our world has become faster-paced and more complicated, the sailors and yachtsmen of yesteryear have given way to sail and power vessels of all sizes, personal watercraft, kayaks, paddle boards, large and small powerboats, pontoon boats, etc. In many cases the focus today is on an activity like fishing or water sports, rather than on boating for its own sake. Also, many people today don't recognize that a 'squadron' is not a military organization or that as a 'power' organization we are not selling electricity. To continue to achieve its mission the USPS has chosen to broaden its appeal and raise its profile. Hence a new brand.

The 'Brand Promise' of USPS is that we are an 'active', 'vibrant' and 'welcoming' 'boating organization' that supports its members. We 'boat together', 'learn together' and 'help each other and the boating community.' The goal is to be more inclusive of the entire boating community.

Through the coming months USPS will be transitioning to be known as "America's Boating Club, For Boaters, By Boaters". The USPS marketing message is that we help people learn boating skills, we engage with boating friends and we connect and support the boating community. Your Bridge Officers are engaged in the question about how to adopt the new USPS Brand for the Marco Island Sail and Power Squadron. Like the United States Power Squadrons, our official name won't change, but our identity probably will. More on this subject in the coming months.

EDUCATIONAL OFFICER Lt/C Thomas Ryan, AP

Our Fall 2018 Education program is underway! We have the Instructors, the material, the classroom – all we need are the students – you! Please take a look at the schedule in this issue and consider signing up for a course. As we men-



tioned last month we have set up several seminars for October, November and December. They are two-hour sessions scheduled in the morning and intended specifically for our membership. Of course, the primary purpose of taking a seminar is to learn or review some aspect of safe boating. But there is a secondary benefit – staying active, camaraderie and being part of the team. So, taking a seminar isn't only a learning process it's also a healthy activity! Join the program. See pages 8 and 10 in this edition for more information on classes and seminars.

We recently received the material for the new Boat Handling course. As you recall, this course is replacing Seamanship. We like the new material. It's a little more practical, more focused and much more illustrative. We plan to be one of the "pilot" sites for Boat Handling. Unlike Seamanship that had eight chapters or sessions, Boat Handling has six. Two of the six, Rules of the Road and Anchoring, will replace the corresponding seminars. For the initial "pilot" session, students will sign up for Boat Handling, take the six chapters and upon successful completion of the six chapters and a test, they will receive the "Seamanship" rating. (It is envisioned that at some point each chapter will be offered as a seminar and once a student has completed all six chapters at their own pace, they may sign up for the test and achieve the "S" rating. But that's still a little ways off). The manual for the "pilot" offering will be electronic. The students who sign up for this offering will actually be part of the evaluation team – pretty cool! If you have been thinking about signing up for Seamanship, now would be a great time. We will have the latest material and we have a chance to make sure the course reflects our special concerns here on Marco Island. If you have any questions, please give me a call on 908-432-8767.

As you review the schedule you will see that we are offering Navigation in January. We have not offered this course for a while. We have offered JN for the last few years and now have enough candidates who qualify for the final advanced course. We would appreciate an early show of interest. If you are currently JN and interested in taking the N course please let us know.



SAFETY OFFICER Lt Ed Bauer

As we prepare for the fall boating season now is a good time to check your safety equipment.

Flares Your boat must be equipped with three in-date flares. Out of date flares may be disposed of at the MI Recycle Center.

Distress Flag More visible than flares for daytime use.



SOS Distress Light Electronic Flare -

Coast Guard approved- alternative to flares; don't forget spare batteries. Available for less than \$100.

Sound Producing Device A whistle will comply but an airhorn is more effective

<u>Fire Extinguishers</u> Boats under 26' are required to have one class B -1 on board, over 26', two; check to see if the indicators are green.

<u>Personal Flotation Devices</u> (PFD's) Types II and III are generally suitable for our waters. Consider inflatables as they allow more movement when not in the water. Do you have enough PFD's on the boat and appropriate sizes for children? If required, is your throwable in good condition? Remember, using these as cushions compresses them and makes them less effective.

<u>Navigation Lights</u> Are they operative? Do you keep spare fuses on the boat?

<u>VHF Marine Radio</u> Handheld models are available for as little as \$80; make sure the battery is holding a charge.

<u>GPS</u> Sonar equipped models are very helpful in our surrounding, shallow waters; make sure that the transducer is free of scale and marine growth.

<u>Anchor</u> Is it properly sized for your boat? Are shackles and chains in good condition? Are lines long enough? <u>Chart</u> Do you have a local chart?

First Aid Kit Have you replenished since it was last used?

<u>Battery</u> Are your terminals clean and connections tight?

Registration Do you have a current sticker?

Tools and Duct Tape can be useful in an emergency.

Or, ask a certified Power Squadron member to perform a Vessel Safety Check with you, on your boat.
