OCTOBER DINNER MEETING

We welcomed back many full-time and seasonal members at our first dinner meeting of the season on October 10th at the Marco Island Yacht Club. Our speaker that night was Professor Joanne Mueller from Florida Gulf Coast University. Professor Mueller is a paleo climatologist and assistant professor in the Marine and Ecological Sciences Department. Her talk was on the evolving nature of storms in southwest Florida and she spoke about her research on the intensity of hurricanes in our local area. Her research, called paleotempestology, involves taking core samples out of the shallow saltwater lagoons behind Keeywaydin Island and comparing the soil from recent and older samples in order to determine the strength of a storm. In addition to Dr. Mueller's talk, we swore in two new members, Marc Pellegrini and Cherie Roginsky, and celebrated Bob Belliveau's 50 (!) years as a member of USPS. 

Squadron realigning itself to be recognized as America's Boating Club® Marco Island.


Boating fun and activities are outlined in our Administrative Officer's column with places and things to do. Please refer to his column for specific dates and places.

EDUCATIONAL OFFICER Lt/C Thomas Ryan, AP

We've had our first classes of the season in October. We completed the first session of the ABC course and are gearing up for the second session beginning December 4. We also had a successful well-attended double seminar of Charting



and GPS. I was particularly pleased that many of the students were members. It manifests one of our slogans "Come for the boating education, stay for the friends."

In October we took part in the district conference. One of the roundtable sessions focused on a software charting package called OpenCPN. According to the website - "OpenCPN is a free software project to create a concise chart plotter and navigation software, for use underway or as a planning tool. OpenCPN is developed by a team of active sailors using real world conditions for program testing and refinement". OpenCPN provides a capability for downloading any of the NOAA charts to a computer. Then you can use the computer for trip planning by defining waypoints, routes etc. The information can be downloaded to a variety of GPS. It's a very useful tool and I am considering offering the information as a seminar in the future. Check it out on the web https://opencpn.org

The most important thing for this month is the trial run of the new Boat Handling course. I really need your help to make this a success. We have agreed to be one of the beta sites for this updated replacement of Seamanship. We would like to have a full class if possible. We are limiting attendance only to Squadron members and recent ABC graduates. If you have not completed Seamanship in the past, please consider participating in the class. It will start on November 12 and consist of six sessions plus a review and test. It will be held on Monday and Thursday evenings at 6pm and there will be no class during Thanksgiving week. The specific dates are 11/12, 11/15, 11/26, 11/29, 12/3, 12/6, and the review on 12/10. Everyone who signs up for this offering will actually be part of the evaluation team. Members who sign up for this trial session will be issued an electronic key to download the student manual. Additionally, a 250-page hard copy will be provided free of charge. As an added incentive we are offering this initial session of the course at our cost of \$60. If you have been thinking about signing up for Seamanship, now would be a great time. We will have the latest material and we have a chance to make sure the course reflects our special concerns here on Marco Island. If you have any questions, please give me a call on 908-432-8767.



SAFETY OFFICER Lt Ed Bauer

Susan and I recently had an occasion to operate a large, diesel powered boat with many closed spaces. It was our first opportunity to have concerns for the possibility of being overcome by carbon monoxide fumes.



Carbon monoxide (CO) is a colorless, odorless, and tasteless gas that is essential-

ly undetectable by human senses. It is produced when an engine that uses a carbon-based fuel like gasoline or diesel is running.

If you can smell exhaust then CO is present. Carbon monoxide is also produced when propane, charcoal, or oil burns to power onboard appliances such as a stove, grill, hot water heater or generator. The most common source is the gasoline-powered engine which is found on the majority of recreational motor boats. Here are some facts about CO:

- CO enters the bloodstream though the lungs by breathing in this dangerous gas
- You cannot see, smell or taste CO
- The most common source of CO is a running engine
- An improperly tuned engine is more likely to produce elevated levels of CO
- Install and maintain a marine grade CO detector
- CO can make you sick in seconds and high concentrations of CO can kill
- CO symptoms are similar to and often confused with seasickness or alcohol intoxication
- Avoid closed-off, poorly ventilated areas of a boat when its engine is running
- Never ride or hang on a swim platform where gases accumulate when the engine is running
- If CO is suspected, open all windows, hatches, and ports to ventilate
- Move a person to fresh air if CO poisoning is suspected and seek medical attention

To avoid CO you should know the areas of where CO can accumulate such as inadequately ventilated canvas enclosures and engine compartments. If you are tied to a dock be certain exhaust ports aren't blocked which can force exhaust back into the boat and if you are rafted to another boat be certain exhaust from one boat doesn't enter the other. Another way for exhaust to enter a boat is when a moving boat creates the station wagon effect where exhaust finds its way back aboard because of circular airflow known as back drafting.

DISTRICT 22 CONFERENCE UPDATES

Here's an update of key take-aways from the D22 conference last month:

- 2017 National dues increase of \$2 is tracked and used solely for marketing of the America's Boating Club branding. Being used for banners, ads, magazines, surveys, etc.. One result is organizations coming to USPS asking to be a partner.
- National is trying to get corporate sponsors. Could have positive impact on dues.
- No dues increases are required for National, District or MISPS.
- Target for marketing is aimed at two groups. One: outdoor enthusiasts, age 55-62, emptynester, boating is a way of life by themselves, want to be a better boater, and education to increase confidence. Second: Social adventurer, age slightly younger, groups and families, environmentalists, have a reason to go boating, tend towards being more affluent.
- There is a discount from Boat US for towing for USPS members.
- Office Depot provides cost reductions to members and use of card gives a donation to USPS. Card can be used for more than squadron material. See Peggy Reiss to learn how to apply.
- Invite other organizations to make presentations to us or for us to make presentations to them. A method to get people from other organizations to join us.
- Cooperative Charting program is still in existence but information is not being sent to NOAA. Data can go to USACE, USCG, state, county and local.
- New prototype Boat Handling course replaces Seamanship more information, less redundancy. MISPS's course starts in November. Contact Tom Ryan. New Marine Navigation course to replace Piloting course should be available in late 2019. All other advanced courses are being modified, improved.
- Open CPN navigation software program and how to get updated electronic charts is free. See Tom Ryan on how to download.
- Membership in USPS continues to decline, however MISPS is up 5%.
- Thanks to efforts from Peggy Reiss, Meg Smith, Carol Musco and donations from MISPS members and other Squadrons and their members the Chinese Auction earned a record amount this Fall.
- Commander's Meeting was a huge success due Gene Burson's leadership. Numerous interactions by various squadron bridge members resulted in guidance and round-table topics for the future.
- D22 Conference meeting was held to 90 minutes with a social event with one free drink and hors d'oeuvres held after the meeting.
- Budget for 2019-2020 was passed.
- Fifty year membership plaque was identified for Gene Burson to present to Bob Belliveau SN. Plaque was presented to Bob at MISPS's October general membership meeting.
- C&R to Ruskin is scheduled for 31 Oct to 3 Nov. USPS Annual meeting in Orlando will be 21 -23 Feb 2019.
