

ments. In addition to our regular expenses, we would like to expand the advertising in the areas of education, vessel safety checks, and benefits of membership.


At our dinner meeting that night, the general membership agreed that such a program is necessary and beneficial for the Squadron.

Forty Years! Wow!! In 1978
Marco Island was mostly vacant
land. About the only people who
had the vision to see what Marco
would become were named
'Mackle.' Karen and I came here
that year to look at a lot her Dad
had bought. We went home thinking he was nuts. Whacko! Off the



deep end! There was very little here. Yet the year before, a group of Marco people had the vision to start a Power Squadron to build a boating community, teach boating skills and strive to make boating both safe and fun in and around Marco Island and took the steps for petition the United States Power Squadrons (USPS) for a Squadron Charter. Amazing.

This month we celebrate that hardy band of 66 Founders and all who have succeeded them. America's Boating Club – Marco Island, aka Marco Island Sail and Power Squadron, owes its existence to the foresighted people who were boaters in that era. Lest we forget – THANK YOU! Many thanks to our founders, leaders and to the many, many volunteers and the people who generously have and continue to give their time, talent and treasure to make boating and this organization what it is today.

Much has been accomplished in 40 years. The data isn't available back to 1978, but just from November, 2004 – 537 people have taken the ABC Course; from April, 2011 – 189 have taken another Course; from February, 2008 – 287 people have taken a seminar. Think of what the numbers would be if we could reach back to 1978! To give you a sense, if you take a yearly average of those numbers and multiply by 40 years it would mean that an estimated 3,750 +/- boaters here may have taken Squadron courses since our organization began. Then think of all the cruises, boat outings, meetings and events that have been held over 40 years. Very impressive.

On 31 December 1978, Commander Arthur L. Schultz wrote to all members: "Thanks to the hard work of many dedicated individuals, our charter was granted in record time. We can all take a large measure of pride in this accomplishment. The promise our Squadron holds for Marco Island in boating

#### **EDUCATION OFFICER**

Lt Tom Ryan

The week before Thanksgiving we completed the second session of the Boat Handling Course. The topic was docking and undocking. My take-aways from that class were: Evaluate the situation including wind and current, Do it slowly,



Use lines to help, and Practice. My first boat was a 21' Grady White wooden Lapstrake. (One summer I actually replaced the wooden ribs – but that's a topic for another article). I used to keep the boat at a dock, behind a popular restaurant in Sandy Hook New Jersey. The dock was at the mouth of the Shrewsbury River very close to a large bridge. It seems that there was always a rip current under the bridge and a strong breeze coming in from the ocean. It was very difficult to get in and out of my slip. That's probably why it was so cheap. That plus the fact that the boaters coming in and going out provided the entertainment for the restaurant patrons. At that time, I hadn't had any boating classes and it took a while before I learned how to use lines to help with docking and undocking. Even when we first moved to Marco, my dock was a little difficult to get into. Under normal circumstances I could maneuver with my single engine. But when it was windy or there was a strong current a spring line helped a lot. "Ann Marie quick get off and secure the line to that cleat"!

Our courses cover a lot of useful and instructional material, but practice is required to develop the skill. As a reminder, our club offers free on-the-water training to our members on their boats. To take advantage of this, call me and we can set you up with a trainer.

Our 2018 classes are drawing to a close. We are in the middle of the first Boat Handling course and we expect to complete it in early December. We have 9 students and they are all experienced boaters. We should get some good feedback. We had our first ABC class in October and we have another one starting December 4, ending on the 18th. We also completed six seminars. As we begin the new year, we have a number of advanced courses for our members. We have another session of Boat Handling (formerly Seamanship) starting on 1/28 running through 2/18. This is the first advancement course and completion earns the "S" designation. Our Piloting course begins on 1/7 and runs through 3/4. This is a fun class and teaches you how to navigate. You learn how to use charts, create safe routes and calculate distances and arrival times. We have a Navigation class beginning on 1/4. This is a follow-up to the JN class and teaches celestial navigation. Engine Maintenance and Weather complete our Winter/Spring advanced course curriculum.



#### SAFETY OFFICER Lt Ed Bauer

**MAYDAY!** Fire on Board!

One evening during an offshore sailboat race, the cook spilled stove fuel across the cooking area. Flames immediately engulfed the galley and the entire off-watch crew sprung into action to put out the fire. After several moments the flames were extinguished, and the only casualties were



some clothing used to put out the flames. Lessons learned: a fire on board will happen suddenly and without warning and will, once a fire starts, spread quickly and be difficult to put out.

A response plan should be implemented immediately.

- 1. Send out a MAYDAY on channel 16 providing the name and location of the boat, the situation and the number of adults and children on board.
- 2. Everyone must don life jackets, immediately.
- 3. Decide to fight the fire or abandon ship. Make sure that all crew and passengers are accounted for.
- 4. Shut down all fuel and electrical systems.
- 5. Position the boat so that the fire is downwind.

If the hull is fiberglass and starts to burn there is little that can be done to save the boat. A burning boat produces thick, black smoke that can be seen for miles. Nearby boats will arrive quickly to pick up you and your crew but should never try to rescue people off the burning boat and risk catching their boat on fire.

Prevention is the key to preventing boat fires. Check engine electrical wires and wiring harness' for chafing and make sure connections are tight Check fuel lines for leaking or seeping gasoline. Always use the blower before starting an enclosed inboard engine; close hatches when refueling and if you smell gasoline fumes at any time, do not start the engine. Make sure the water intake is not blocked and the water pump impeller is working properly to ensure that the engine does not overheat. Replace a liquid fuel stove with propane or some other safer cooking system. Make sure that all fire extinguishers are fully charged, in date and readily accessible to those on board.

We also have several seminars scheduled including Weather 1/4, Anchoring 1/8, and Charting and GPS 1/29-30. I would like to add in another VHF radio seminar in the February timeframe.

Finally, if anyone has not taken the ABC course, it is well worth the time. It covers the fundamentals and upon completion you receive Florida safe boater certification (which may get you a discount on boat insurance).

#### **Time for Vessel Safety Checks**

Now is the time to start thinking about getting your vessel safety check for 2019. MISPS provides free vessel safety checks not only to our members, but to the Marco Island Community at large. The inspection will include a survey of your safety equipment (such as life vests, flares, fire extinguishers, horns, lights) and up-to-date registration paperwork. The inspections can last about 30 minutes. If your vessel passes the safety check you will receive a decal that shows your boat has been inspected and passed. This shows that you care about the safety of your boat and passengers. If your boat doesn't pass the inspection, the inspector will tell you what needs to be added or replaced and can come back to recheck your boat.

## An Unusual Boating Adventure by Lt's. Susan & Ed Bauer

In September we joined two friends and chartered a narrowboat for a week long trip on the Llangollan Canal through western England and into Wales. Narrowboating on the UK's canals is quite popular and the boats are very similar as they must fit into the original locks, under bridges, over aqueducts, and through tunnels originally built over two hundred years ago for commercial traffic. Our boat, the Pride of Furness, was 57' in length with a beam of 6'10"; it weighed 17 tons and was powered by a diesel under the aft deck. It had berths for 4 with 2 heads, shower, galley, TV, and dining area. It was a beast to steer.

We motored west from Ellesmere through pastoral farmlands in Shropshire and into the hills of Wales to the town of Llangollan. Usually we moored for the evening near a village where we could find a welcoming pub. Regularly, passing boats hailed us to ask about our MISPS burgee.

Along the way we stopped to walk to castles, ride on a scenic steam railroad and explore small villages. A special feature of our trip was crossing the Pontcysyllte Aqueduct -1,000' long – steel & cast iron, 130' above the valley and 200 years old. Our boat was equipped with a headlight for passage through the Chirk Tunnel, ¼ mile in length.
