

Boating Education is at the core of what we do. The mission of America's Boating Club – *Marco Island* is to do all we can to make boating safer for our members and other boaters. We teach courses and seminars, inspect vessels, survey aids to navigation and organize outings to give our members practiced boating skills and experience – all to improve safety. But at the center of it all is education.



That is why I want to recognize two Club leaders who have and will guide our education program.

First, Lt/C Tom Ryan, AP, who has been the Squadron Education Officer (SEO) for about 15 months. He and his deputy 1Lt John Maciolek, AP, and the many instructors who make our courses possible have done an excellent job teaching both new and experienced boaters. Recently, some family obligations caused Tom and Ann Marie to return to their home up north for an indeterminate amount of time. As a result, Tom felt he could not give the Club's education program his full time and attention. He was conflicted because he did not want to leave his important post without leadership. To his great credit, Tom has worked for many weeks to develop the course schedule for 2019-20, recruit instructors and organize several former SEO's to advise the education effort. I can't thank him enough for all his leadership and hard work.

Second, I want to recognize and thank P/C Tippy Cavanagh, SN, for agreeing to step in and assume the role of SEO. Tom sought recommendations for his successor from his 'gray beard' group of former SEO's. Tippy was at the top of the list. On May 5th Tippy was approved by District Education Officer D/Lt/C Jack Nason, SN, (as the bylaws require) and she was elected during the May ExCom meeting and sworn in by D/C Ted Reiss, SN-CN. Tippy has the qualifications, skills and energy to do a terrific job. She is already getting her mind around how to move forward. I look forward to working with her.

Further, there will be several new instructors joining the Education Department in the fall. More about that later, but let me just say a loud THANK YOU to Tom, Tippy and those who have agreed to teach. It is at the core of what we do.

The winter high season has come and gone, but many of our members in the Executive Department have been busy planning for an active summer and a productive fall leading into our next big season. The Cooperative Charting Team has completed its survey of ATONS and PTONS from Marco Island to Everglades City, chart-



ing 317 Aids to Navigation in all. They have met with Collier County Coastal Zone Management officials, who will be repairing and replacing those ATONS mutually deemed to be of the highest priority. Because of their efforts we will all be safer on the water in the months to come.

The Fundraising Committee has developed sponsorship guidelines and has targeted Friday, January 31 for our next Wine and Hors d'oeuvres Party. All Wine and Hors d'oeuvres Function Chairs have been designated and we are well positioned to begin serious planning in the fall.

Our Marketing Committee has been very active, drafting numerous Safety Tips for boaters designed for publication in our local newspapers. A series of press releases are being developed on a variety of subjects, including America's Boating Channel, Vessel Safety Checks, Safe Boating and Cooperative Charting. The Marketing Committee is also developing a new series of brochures designed to promote Club membership, Educational Classes, and Vessel Safety Checks.

Fishing continues to be the primary reason for my boating experiences, and I have enjoyed many days on the water during the past month catching a variety of fish. Two days stand out above the others. On the first, I hooked a five foot tarpon on my light jigging tackle. A very exciting battle ensued over he next five minutes, with the tarpon jumping clear out of the water three times before breaking my inadequate 30 pound leader. A week after losing the tarpon I was reeling in a Spanish mackerel when a bottle nosed dolphin exploded out of the water twenty feet from my starboard beam with my fish in his grinning teeth, snapping my light rod in half before disappearing with my fish. At the May ExCom meeting, I was sworn in as Squadron Education Officer. I would like to express my appreciation to Tom Ryan for all the preliminary work that he has done in



organizing the education schedule and lining up instructors for the fall. Also I want to extend a big thank you to Ted Reiss for his help in getting me comfortable with using HQ800.

On May 9 our last seminar of the season was held. The Hurricane Preparation seminar was attended by nine students, six of whom were Squadron members. D/C Ted Reiss and P/C Rhonda Gloodt did a wonderful job of presenting the materials. Let's hope and pray that no more hurricanes come our way this season, but at least some of us will be better prepared!

The main thing that has struck me as I looked over our course offerings for the past year has been that very few advanced classes were taught. The only student who took Marine Navigation (Piloting) was a nonmember. While we encourage nonmembers to take our courses, I would like to see more participation from our own members. Did you know that only 82 of our members have taken Seamanship (the new name is Boat Handling), while 88 have not? Not even half! It is my mission as your new SEO to increase that number and encourage you all to think about taking our new Boat Handling course in the fall. It will be taught by Nick Rago and Ed Bauer and consists of only six sessions including Rules of the Road, Docking and Undocking, Boating with Confidence, Anchoring, Emergencies on Board, and Knots and Line Handling.

I am looking forward to working with Asst. SEO John Maciolek and all the instructors to provide you with an outstanding offering of courses. If you would like to help out or have a course you would like to see offered, just let me know.

SAFETY OFFICER Lt Ed Bauer, S

Are you prepared for hurricane season? Many of us learned lessons from Irma. Following are suggested safety ideas for this season. PLAN AHEAD and plan to evacuate if necessary. Have necessary supplies on hand well ahead of time – water, non-perishable food, a "go kit", radios, batteries, fuel, insurance cover-



age, a place to shelter, a plan for prep and storage of your boat.

Storing your boat ashore on higher ground is the most recommended method during a hurricane. The most ideal way to secure your boat is to cover and tie it down by attaching straps with minimal to no stretch to eyes set in concrete or helical anchors. If your boat is staying on its trailer during the storm, be sure to let a little bit of air out of the tires to make it more grounded. Block and brace the trailer but leave the trailer jack in the down position.

If you have to store your boat on the water during a hurricane, there are several things to keep in mind. Seek out tall pilings, as shorter pilings aren't very forgiving during a storm surge. Always assume that at least one cleat or piling will give out. Each of your lines should include a mate running in the same direction but attached to a different spot on both the boat and the dock. Boats that aren't properly secured can become damaged, but they can also damage other structures or cause fuel and oil pollution.

Some experts recommend not keeping your boat on a lift during a hurricane. A storm surge could wipe out the entire dock and take your boat with it. The surge could force your boat up through the roof of the lift, or even fill it with water and cause the lift to completely give out from the weight.

Regardless of where or how your boat is stored, remember to remove anything from your boat that could be easily picked up in the wind like biminis, chairs and cushions. Rain can be a major problem – ensure that your drain plug has been removed. Use plastic or Tyvectm with duct tape to protect uncovered consoles, electronics, key holes, etc. from 150 mph driven rain.


