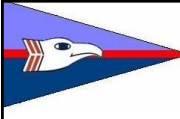

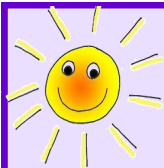


The America's Boating Club brand was step one. The USPS adopted the new brand to make the organization be more accessible, understandable and relatable to more people in today's more casual lifestyle.

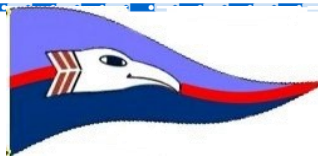

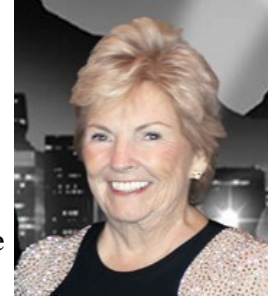

Last season MISPS was one of 18 squadrons from 14 districts in USPS who participated in the pilot program for the new Boat Handling course (a new name for Seamanship). The new course has eliminated the overlap with ABC material and consists of six sessions. Each session may be taken separately, but in order to achieve the coveted "S" designation after your name, you must complete all six seminars. It is one of my top priorities as your new SEO to encourage anyone who has not taken this course to do so this year. Three different sessions are being offered beginning with the first on November 12. Please consider attending. Even if you are a seasoned boater, there is always something new to learn!

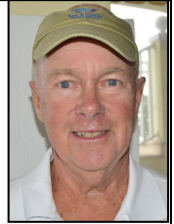
Please take time to look at the Education Schedule on our website and think about taking a course or seminar. Besides the ABC and Boat Handling courses, Marine Navigation (P), Advanced Celestial Navigation (N), Weather and Engine Maintenance are being offered. We also have the seminars Charting/GPS, Partner in Command, Hurricane Preparation and VHF/DSC Radio on the calendar. The quiet summer months would be a great time to check out the new videos on America's Boating Channel. The topics of their newest series of videos include cold water survival, boating under the influence (BUI), life jacket wear, stand-up paddleboard safety, electronic navigation and situational awareness. To access these videos, all you have to do is google "America's Boating Channel." United States Coast Guard grants have funded this channel. Stay safe on the water and happy boating!



## SAFETY OFFICER

Have you ever wondered *WHY BOATS SINK AT THE DOCK?* The BoatUS Foundation examined 100 claims for sinking and found that for every boat that sinks in open water, four sink at the dock. When a boat sinks at the dock, the skipper is most likely asked, "What happened to the bilge pump?"



However, that's the wrong question to ask. Bilge pumps can actually hide the real problem because they periodically empty the bilge until they either clog or the battery dies, the bilge fills with water, and the boat sinks.

The skipper cannot expect the boat to take care of itself. Periodically examine all fittings and hoses for water tightness at through-hulls. Leaks at underwater fittings occur in 50 percent of sinkings, with the majority happening at stuffing boxes.

Heavy weather events such as rain or snow account for another 32 percent of sinkings. By lowering the waterline, the precipitation makes a boat more likely to flood during any minor mishap on board.

Poor docking arrangements can allow the boat to get caught under a dock or bang against a piling, damaging the hull to the extent that the boat can take on water and sink. Arrange bow, stern and spring lines to keep the boat in the center of the slip.

Examine outdrive boots for deterioration periodically and replace any rubber that looks dried out and cracked. Store the outdrive down to prolong the life of the rubber. Examine the seacocks and gate valves for corrosion, which looks pinkish or bronze.

Inspect transducer and raw water intake strainer through-hulls as well. Hoses connected to the fittings must be double clamped with stainless steel clamps. Through-hull connected hoses should be the black reinforced kind, not PVC hoses, which can rupture and crack.

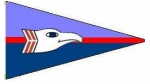
Turn the water off at the dock whenever you are away from the boat for more than a few hours.

If you need a reason to visit your boat more often, consider that repairing a boat that has been underwater usually costs about 40 percent of the boat's value. If you cannot visit regularly, consider implementing a buddy system with other boat owners. Many marinas offer inspections at an extra cost.

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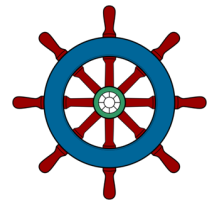

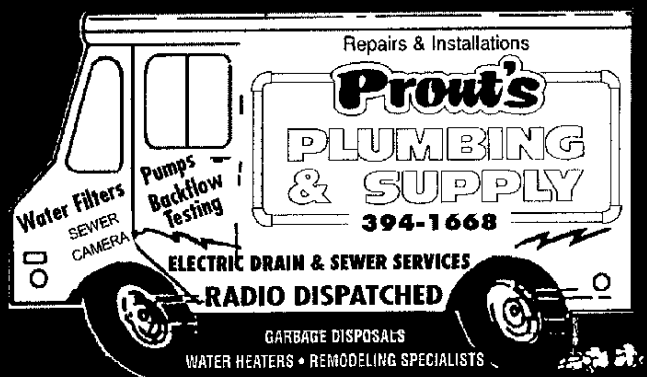
