

EDUCATION OFFICER

Even though the weather doesn't feel like it, fall season is upon us and that means the start of our educational programs for the upcoming year. Our course schedule is included in this issue.



Please take some time to look it over and see if there are any courses that might interest you. We are offering five sessions of America's Boating Course. The first one starts on October 21. Maybe you know a friend or neighbor who might be interested? Let them know about our courses that are available to the public.

Boat Handling will be offered three times this year. This is the replacement course for Seamanship. It has six sessions, and upon completion, you will receive the "Seamanship" rating after your name. I'm preaching to the choir here. There are so many of our members who have never taken an advanced course. Please consider signing up for this newly revised format.

P/C Gene Burson, JN, will be teaching Marine Navigation. This is the new name for Piloting, the first of the advanced navigation classes. It focuses on techniques for piloting a boat in coastal and inland conditions.

I will be teaching Advanced Celestial Navigation. Calling all JN students! Now is the time to sign up. The class will start on October 29, take a long break during the holidays and then start up again in January. You will be introduced to additional sight reduction techniques for bodies other than the sun. Navigational software is used for planning and navigating in the offshore environment.

Seminars, such as Charting/GPS, Hurricane Preparedness and VHF/DSC Radio will be offered during the upcoming season. They offer valuable safety information for all boaters and are open to the public.

Have you ever looked at boating-related apps on your smart phone or tablet? There are some really cool ones out there. BOAT MASTER by Tommy Vaux is a free educational gaming app that challenges you to dock different-sized boats in various conditions. ANIMATED KNOTS by Grog uses animation to show you how to tie nautical knots, step-by-step. And for my celestial navigation students, there are PLANETS, NIGHT SKY and EMERALD OBSERVATORY.

Hope to see you at one of our many courses. Be safe on the water!



SAFETY OFFICER Lt Ed Bauer, S

Are you fueling up correctly?

Regardless of your vessel, it's important to keep in mind the challenges and hazards of fueling it. Bigger boats mean bigger fuel tanks—and that means more fuel to create hazards for our environment and your safety.



At the Pump

- Gasoline fumes are extremely flammable, and most boat fires and explosions occur either while fueling or immediately afterward. There are plenty of dockside fuel stations in our area, but dock-based gas nozzles tend to pump fuel faster than those at automotive service stations.
- Turn off engines and all electrical equipment, including radios, stoves, and other appliances.
- Have a fire extinguisher within reach.
- Extinguish cigarettes and any other smoking materials or flames.
- Don't rely on hands-free or automatic shut-off features. <u>Attend the nozzle at all times, and never</u> <u>fill your fuel tank to the top</u>. Fuel expands as it heats up, especially in warm weather, so allow enough room in your tanks for this expansion to avoid leaking fuel into the water.
- If you have a metal fuel tank, maintain nozzle contact with the fill pipe to prevent static spark and spills. Hold a cloth under the nozzle to catch any drips and be sure to wipe up any spillage that occurs.
- After fueling, secure the filler cap to prevent fuel from leaking or water from entering the tank.
- Before you start the engine, open all ports, hatches, and doors to ventilate and run the blower for at least four minutes, then check the bilge for any fuel vapors. Don't start the engine until you do a proper "sniff test" for gasoline odor on the boat. If your boat doesn't pass the test, continue ventilating and checking for possible leaks.
- When filling fuel cans and portable tanks, remove them from the boat and fill them onshore. Do not carry unsecured portable tanks on your vessel; a sudden movement could cause them to move about, leak or rupture and ignite.
- When filling inboard tanks, close all hatches and cabin openings to prevent fumes from getting into interior spaces of your boat.
- To avoid air locks and sudden spills, be sure your boat is level while fueling. That means having passengers disembark at the dock.


