

Safety is job one. America's Boating Club - Marco Island has a mission to make boating in and around Marco Island, Florida safer. Some say, 'safety doesn't sell.' I beg to differ. This club is comprised of people who believe in safe boating and take action to make it so.



Think about all we do toward that end. The Club will teach as many as 19 courses this year to educate people about how to operate a boat and obtain the skills they need to be happy, successful boaters. Our vessel safety examiners will inspect hundreds of boats to assure they are equipped properly, and that the essential equipment is current and in good working condition. Dozens of our members will fan out from the 10.000 Islands to near Naples to inspect and record the condition of boating markers [aids to navigation (ATONS)] and provide that information free of charge to the governments that must maintain them. We organize numerous boat outings to have fun, but also to help our members gain experiential learning to improve their operating skills. And increasingly, we are extending our reach by educating through new channels to those who may not know what they don't know by way of 'Safe Boating Tips' and submitted articles in the local papers. In November, many members will participate as "talent" in the production of short videos about boating skills by the producers of America's Boating Channel.

This year we have placed greater emphasis on assuring that all the Club's members are 'walking the walk.' We have shown an America's Boating Channel production at each member meeting. We are encouraging all members who have not taken an advanced course to sign up for Boat Handling, which teaches very practical boating skills. If you haven't earned an 'S' grade, I hope you will do so this year. The course is fun and covers a lot of good stuff. At the member meeting this month we began distribution of Guidelines for Boaters, developed by P/C Jim Olmes and a cast of many. This publication is a benefit of ABClub Marco Island membership. We will be providing one to every member family. It is meant to be carried on your boat to provide the most essential information you need to be safe. It is a terrific resource. It contains key check lists and outlines the pre-trip safety briefing that we plan to use on all our significant cruise outings. Thank you to all who contributed to the Guidelines and particularly to Intercoastal Marine Service who sponsored its production.

As we did last year, we will mobilize our members to assemble, wearing life jackets, to pose for a photo that will appear in local news media. Our message to all of our boating friends and neighbors is that wearing life jackets saves lives. Participating with us will be the Civil Air Patrol, Collier Sheriffs Department, Florida Fish and Wildlife, Flotilla 95, US Coast Guard - Auxiliary, Marco Bay Yacht Club, Marco Fire and Police Departments, Marco Island Yacht Club, Marco Sportfishing Club and the Sailing Association of Marco Island.

To prepare for this year's *Wear It* event, I read a pamphlet entitled "Saved By The Jacket", which relates the stories of dozens of people across the country whose lives have been saved because they were wearing their life jackets when boating emergencies struck. The stories are a sobering admonition that accidents on the water happen much too fast to reach for and put on a stowed life jacket.

Did you know that drowning is the reported cause of death in eighty percent of all boating fatalities, and that eighty three percent of drowning victims in recreational boating accidents were not wearing a life jacket in 2016? Won't you please act on that knowledge now, and do what boating safety advocates recommend? Ensure that everyone on board your boat has a life jacket, and demand that they all *Wear It*!

Our first ABC class was held on October 21. The last class will meet on November 4, and the second session starts on Monday, December 2. Perhaps you know a neighbor or friend who would like to take this course?



Please encourage them to give me a call. I want to thank our instructors for all the hard work they put into teaching this class. They include John Maciolek, Peggy Reiss, Bill Kreppein and Kathleen Reynolds. Andy Battaglia and Bill Hughes were a huge help with assisting students with knot tying.

Our first Boat Handling course will start on November 12. It's not too late to sign up! It will be held Tuesdays and Fridays evenings at 6:00 p.m. Nick Rago and Ed Bauer are the instructors. This class replaces the old Seamanship course and consists of six topics that may be taken individually as seminars or together as the Boat Handling course. The six topics include Rules of the Road, Confidence in Docking and Undocking, Boating with Confidence: Handling your Boat Underway, Anchoring with Assurance, Emergencies on Board and Knots and Line Handling. Students who successfully pass the exam will get credit for the course (and an "S" after their name) as well as seminar credit for the sessions they attended. Only 50% of our membership has taken this course. I encourage all of you who have not taken it to consider this new and updated version. It is the first of our advanced courses and provides fundamental information on how to operate your boat.

In early October our Squadron participated in the D22 Conference in Punta Gorda. Jim Olmes and I took the instructor re-certification seminar, while other members attended Marine Surveying, AIS and Skipper Saver roundtables.

SAFETY OFFICER Lt Ed Bauer, S

Four members of a Washington State Power Squadron took a journey to northern British Columbia to go fishing with their new tricked-out 12- foot skiff. The sun came out, and the rain stayed away, but the winds weren't too cooperative. On the second day, the guys were out trolling the lake. Mike thought he heard a



noise. He looked around and saw nothing, so they fished on. After they returned to shore, they learned what Mike had heard was, in fact, a distress call.

A young couple and their Scotty, who had camped nearby, were out fishing in their new canoe. It was only their second day in the vessel. The man hooked a fish which felt like a good one. He stood up to play it. As the fish got closer to the boat, Fido heard the splashing and leapt to the side of the boat. Over went the boat. The woman had her PFD on, but the man scrambled to get his on with the dog clawing at his chest in panic. Finally, he secured his vest and calmed the dog. When they looked around, they could see no one, and they were too far from shore to swim. Their canoe and the gear had all sunk, so they had nothing to hold onto. They began to holler, and scream and holler again, but no one could hear them. They waited and hollered some more.

This story could have had a tragic ending, but fortunately a local woman was on her deck with her binoculars and noticed the commotion on the lake. She hailed help, and they were rescued. After more than an hour in the water, the couple and their dog were grateful to be back on dry land. Later they realized that if the woman had had a whistle attached to her life jacket, Mike and his fishing partner, Ray, who were near enough to have heard it, could have turned an hour in the water waiting for rescue into a matter of minutes.

So what does the story teach us?

- Wear your life vest.
- Don't stand in a canoe.
- Dogs aren't good fishing buddies.
- Wear your whistle.




