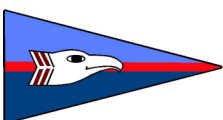

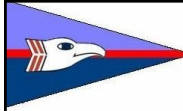

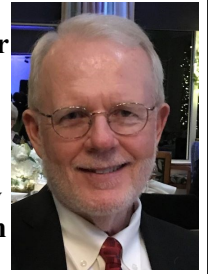

For the summer months we will have two editions of the Eagles Eye. There will be a June/July issue which will publish at the end of May. The August/September issue will publish at the end of July.



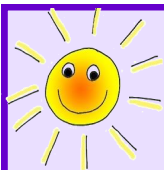
**COMMANDER**

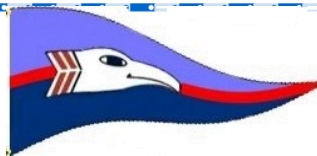

Let’s think out of the box come up with some crazy ideas and when we can toss them around. Maybe even have a good laugh or find a nugget for real change that would benefit all.

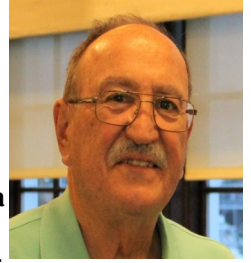
In the meantime, we can check in on each other by phone or email. If anyone needs anything, give one of us on the Bridge a call, and we will get the best person to respond.



Stay safe everyone!

Whether it's the end or beginning of the season, or you're just moving your boat to a different body of water, safe trailering should always be a consideration. Accidents always occur suddenly and usually for lack of preparation. I once had a loaded trailer come loose when the nut on the bottom of the trailer hitch ball came loose. The ball and trailer popped up and fell on the safety chains. Fortunately, I had just exited the interstate and was travelling slowly at the time. I had failed to tighten the ball nut prior to leaving home. Some safety suggestions follow:

**Lights on** Are your brake, turning and taillights operational? Have a friend help check them out. Keep a spare bulb in the vehicle, Ensure that the wires are properly connected and not dragging.

**Your hitch** Using the incorrect hitch ball is an avoidable mistake because the tongue or trailer should have the ball size requirement listed right on it. Once you determine the diameter of the mounting hole in the ball mount, choose a ball shank diameter of the same size. Make sure that the shank can extend past the nut by at least 1 thread.

**Vehicle towing specs** Before you plan a trip, it's crucial to know how much your vehicle is rated to tow. Don't forget to include not only the boat weight but all your gear as well as boat fuel. Always keep an eye on your tire pressure and temperature gauge.


**Secure gear** After a day out on the water, life jackets, seat cushions, fishing gear and trash should never be allowed to fly out of your boat. Take full advantage of your boat's stowage spaces and secure anything that might take off while you're trailering

**Wash down** Whether leaving fresh or saltwater, wash down the boat, trailer and running gear with clean water. In addition to inhibiting rust, this will limit the possibility of introducing unwanted invasive marine species to your destination.

**On the road** It can be easy to get caught up in the excitement of a new landscape during a road trip but don't lose sight of your precious cargo behind you. Breaking, accelerating, turning and especially backing up requires a lot more attention. Other drivers may not notice you have a trailer in tow, so be aware of what's around you and whether you need extra room on the roadways. Don't feel pressured to move quickly; it's always better to take your time than to risk an accident.

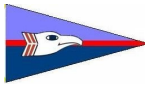

# **America's Boating Club, City of Marco Island, Collier County, and the US Coast Guard Auxiliary Successfully Work Together for Improved Boater Safety—Part 3**

**Editor's Note:** This is the third of a three part series about the work America's Boating Club-Marco Island is doing to improve boating safety in our local waters. A special thank you to Lt Kathleen Reynolds, AP, for authoring this document.

Carl Thieme has relinquished his role as Chair of the Cooperative Charting Committee, but continues to be active in this important safe boating initiative. He leaves, unquestionably, with a sense of accomplishment for all that the Committee has done to enhance boater safety in and around Marco Island.

Cliff Winings, who designed and built the new interactive ATON database, is now Chair of this committee. In the meanwhile, much information is available on the organization's website, [www.marcoboatingclub.org](http://www.marcoboatingclub.org), which reviews and reaffirms the goals of the group:

- Supply information to the US Coast Guard leading to corrections to nautical charts, small craft charts and Coast Pilot publications.
- Inspect Aids to Navigation to identify and report those that are damaged or misplaced to the United States Coast Guard, Collier County Coastal Zone Management Group, and the City of Marco Island
- Focus on a specifically assigned geographic navigation area.

The Marco Island chapter of the now named America's Boating Club has responsibility for the portion of Chart 11430 that is south of Lat 25 deg 59.5 min N. This region extends from a point about one mile north of Marco Island to Everglades City, about 20 miles SE of Marco Island. Survey data is available on the [marcoboatingclub.org](http://marcoboatingclub.org) website, and that data is provided from observations by club members, input from the US Coast Guard Auxiliary determined during their on-the-water patrols, and information provided by the Collier County Coastal Zone Management staff.

Mariners interested in contributing to this ongoing and collaborative boater safety initiative are invited to consider joining America's Boating Club—Marco Island. As members, they can enjoy participation in the many civically minded initiatives the Club undertakes as well as boating educational opportunities and a wide array of social functions. 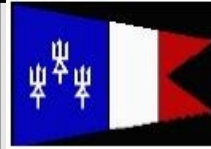

## **Coping with Coronavirus Fears**

It's normal to feel worried when facing an unknown threat like the coronavirus. With the coronavirus in the news everyday, it's only natural to have some anxiety.

### **It can help to remember:**

- It's normal to feel anxious about safety for yourself, your family, friends, and even strangers.
- You've coped with stressful events before, and you can apply these healthy strategies to this situation as well. Focusing on your strengths and abilities can help you deal.
- It's healthy to accept help from community programs and resources.
- Everyone has different ways of coping and meeting their needs.
- Doctors, nurses, and other caregivers are learning more about COVID-19 every day. They are working together with national and international agencies to identify and provide care to patients while avoiding spread of the illness in the community.

### **Staying healthy**

The best advice we have so far includes taking many of the same precautions we take against the flu. These include:

- Wash your hands thoroughly (for at least 20 seconds) frequently, especially after sneezing, blowing your nose, coughing or using the bathroom, and before preparing or eating food.
- If you cough or sneeze, do so into the bend of your elbow, not your hand. Or use a tissue, and then throw it away immediately afterward.
- At home, clean often-touched surfaces such as doors and doorknobs, cabinet handles, bathroom hardware, tabletops, phones, tablets and keyboards regularly with disinfectant.

### **Easing your stress**

Here are some things you can do during this time of public anxiety:

- Limit the time you spend on social media and watching TV coverage about coronavirus, and be aware that rumors circulate on social media that may not be true.
- Talk with someone about your feelings.
- Speak with a counselor who can help you work through your reactions.
- Eat healthy, get enough rest and exercise, relax and/or meditate.
- Spend time with family and friends.
- If you are caring for someone who's contracted corona virus and are feeling afraid, keep in mind that as human beings, and especially as caregivers, even when facing uncertainty, we've taken precautions and moved forward with our purpose according to our values. Remembering your own history of perseverance can help you persist in this new challenge.

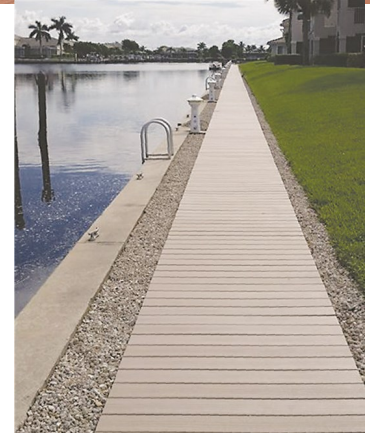
