## CRUISE AROUND MARCO THURSDAY, JUNE 4, 2020

Now that things are starting to open up , the Executive Committee decided that it would be possible to have a boating activity that would fit within the government guidelines. Thus, America's Boating Club-Marco Island will be holding a cruise around Marco Island on Thursday, June 4, 2020.

We will meet at 1130 in the middle of the Marco River near the Snook Restaurant.

We will keep our radios on channel 16 from which we can hail other members and request to switch to channel 78 for conversation.

Ted & Peggy Reiss will lead the cruise with their white 31ft Sea Ray with black top, named JUST US. The Lucky Dog owned by Bob and Rhonda Gloodt will be the last boat.

The cruise will proceed out to the Gulf, going south past the Marco beaches, turn into Caxambas Pass, go through the picket fence, continue to G1 near Ramsey Key, go towards Coon Key Island and head up the east side of Coon Key Island heading towards Goodland. We will pass by Goodland, go under the bridge entering the Marco River and take it back to our starting point near the Snook Restaurant.

Everyone should bring their own drinks and food on their boats.

Fly your squadron flags and burgee if you have them. Burgees can be purchased from the MISPS store. Please call Susan Bauer at 540 817-5745.

Rhonda Gloodt is the cruise captain. Please call 239 450-7089 and let her know if you're planning to attend. Rhonda will also need boat names and description of boats.

We hope to see lots of our ABC-MI members at this Cruise Around Marco!



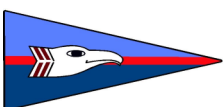

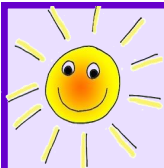
**COMMANDER**

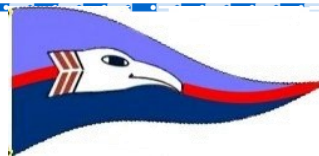

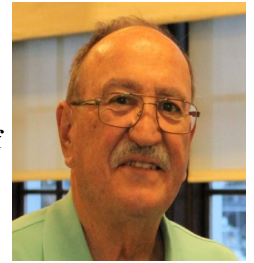

Our education program came to a screeching halt due to the coronavirus. Our fifth and final ABC course was cut short halfway through the sessions in the middle of March. USPS headquarters has recently started up again and exams have been graded. Marine Navigation, ably taught by Gene Burson, has four successful graduates. Congratulations to Shelly Derrough, Dave Randall, Ray Rosenberg and George Vlasuk. They have earned the title "Pilot" after their names. **JOB WELL DONE!**



Since in-person classes are still suspended, this is a great time to consider taking an online course or seminar. USPS offers 10 seminars online: Hurricane Preparation for Boaters; Crew at the Helm; Boating on Rivers, Locks and Lakes; AIS Electronics for Boaters; How to Use GPS; Planning Your Cruise; Propane Systems on Your Boat; Cruising Boats and Systems; Weather for Boaters; and All About Marine Radio. Members of USPS receive a 25% discount. Check them out, and maybe you'll find one you have been meaning to take.

Also offered online is the Boat Handling course (formerly Seamanship). While only second best to the classroom setting, it is a good option at this time. This new course focuses on six topics: Rules of the Road, Confidence in Docking and Undocking, Boating with Confidence, Anchoring with Assurance, Emergencies on Board and Knots and Line Handling. If you are one of our many members who have never taken an advanced grade, why not give it a try?

USPS is also offering Instructor Recertification online. If you are an instructor with lapsed certification and have not been able to attend the seminar at the D22 conference, you can take advantage of this newly developed online individual recertification seminar. ## SAFETY OFFICER

### TEACHING KIDS THE BASICS OF BOATING

**SET AN EXAMPLE** Model safe boating. You won't persuade kids to wear a life jacket, for example, if you don't. Make a habit of putting it on and clicking the buckle, just like a car safety belt, and if necessary, gently remind kids to do the same. Start as soon as you get on the dock. They'll follow your leadership and example. Really, life jackets aren't so bad to wear anymore. Remember those vests that fit poorly, rode up high around the neck and, while they might keep you from drowning, they made you feel like you were being strangled. Today, life jackets are form-fitted and allow free movement. Kid sizes often feature cool designs or cartoon characters "The best, and cheapest, peace of mind you'll ever get."



**ENLIST OLDER KIDS AS ALLIES:** It's a challenge to keep kids — all the parts of each kid, that is — in the boat. It's more fun to dangle an arm over the side and wrestle with the wake. That might be safe enough in the harbor, however. before you know it, an arm can be cracked on a piling. Or worse, a younger passenger trying to keep up with the others leans too far and tumbles overboard.

**ESTABLISH COMMON-SENSE SAFETY PROCEDURES:** Don't have an irrational fear of the propeller, but do respect it. Even at rest, a prop can severely cut a foot or leg. So, keep everybody away from it. Boats designed for skiing, boarding and swimming often have a swim platform over the sterndrive and prop — a margin of safety, sure, but folks still have to beware of kicking the prop while treading water. When people are in the water, no key in the ignition.

**Boating Safety "Sidekicks"** ([www.safeboatingcouncil.org/boating-safety-sidekicks](http://www.safeboatingcouncil.org/boating-safety-sidekicks)): colorful and dynamic games that teach young boaters about safety in watercraft, from kayaks to PWCs to powerboats.

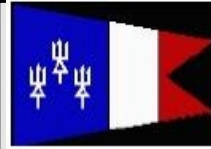

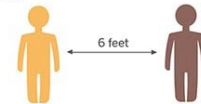

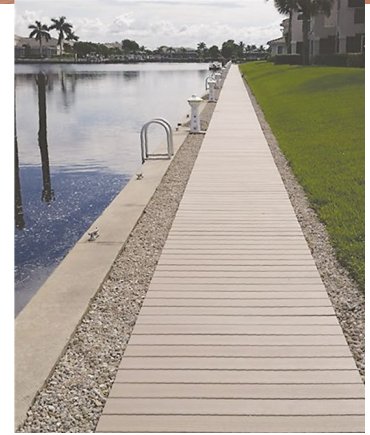
