## **SAFETY IS JOB ONE!**

We've all heard the phrase "Safety is job one". This is just as important to our mission in America's Boating Club-Marco Island as it is in the construction field. Our main goal as an organization is to promote safe boating. We all know too well what can happen when we aren't focused on safety.

The spring months remind us that it's time to get our vessels inspected to make sure that we have all the required safety equipment. Our trained Vessel Safety Examiners are ready to inspect your vessel (power boat, sailboat, jet ski, or kayak) as well as vessels of your friends or neighbors. This is a *free* service to our members and the community and helps insure that everyone's boat meets federal and state recreational boating safety laws regarding the carriage of safety equipment on board their vessel. VSCs are non-punitive and confidential. If you don't pass the first time, you'll be able to correct what is missing and be re-examined at a later date. Upon a successful VSC, you will receive the 2021 VSC sticker to put on your hull or windshield.

On page 13 of the newsletter is the complete inspection form that is used by the VSC examiner. Everyone can take a look at what safety equipment is currently on your vessel prior to your inspection. That way you'll be able to pass on the first attempt. General requirements include registration documentation and numbers, personal flotation devices, fire extinguishers, visual distress signals, sound producing devices, navigation lights, navigation rules, MARPOL trash placard, backfire flame control, ventilation, marine sanitation devices, and state and local requirements. The inspector will also check the general condition of the vessel to insure that the deck is clear of hazards, the bilge is clean and that electrical, fuel and heating systems (if applicable) are operating correctly. Recommended items include a marine radio, anchor and lines, and a first aid kit.

To schedule your VSC contact John Salotto 239-235-1047 (text preferred) or Dan Marinelli 239-900-0299 and they will make sure your vessel gets inspected. If you're interested in becoming a VSC Examiner let John know and he will make sure you get trained.



for the winter/spring is elsewhere in the Eagle's Eye. Due to Covid restrictions we are limiting in-person sessions to 7 individuals or up to 7 couples. Why? We have seven tables to provide proper distance. We take temperatures of each student when they arrive and require masks. After class we wipe down tables and chairs.

Five students from the postponed ABC course from March 2020 registered to complete the course in February. Four non-member couples and one individual read our web site about our Boat Handling course and have registered for the course starting 4 March. There must be more members interested since about 50% of our members have not taken this first of the advanced courses. One member and two nonmembers have expressed interest in the Piloting/ Marine Navigation course so far. What about the other 28 who have passed Seamanship? Four members attended the Operations Training seminar. A Free Conference Call virtual session will be scheduled for several others who could not attend.

A FREE Instructor Development seminar will be scheduled in the spring. We have temporarily lost four instructors due to concerns with Covid. The FREE ID seminar requires four sessions for students to make short presentations and prepare lesson plans. We need instructors. Let me know who is interested so we can set up dates.

Who is interested in a SAIL, Engine Maintenance, or Cruise Planning course? Likewise who is interested in seminars on Partner in Command, GPS, VHF Radio, or Use of Charts? First session is at 9 AM. Please let me know what hour you would like to reserve. <u>An Anchor Drags and Puts Boaters in</u> <u>Peril</u>, a boater's harrowing tale by Tim Bower

"After a weekend lake cruising, my wife and I prepared to anchor our wooden 29-foot outboard-powered trawler. The evening forecast called for southerly winds of 15 mph, so I chose a

protected cove but was exposed to the west. I dropped the hook in 8 feet of water and settled in for the night. Around 1:30 a.m., the wind began howling out of the west. We were sideways to the wind and dragging anchor. There was no time to react, no time to correct we were going ashore.

The starboard-side landing was gentler than I expected. The high water placed us against growth that would normally be several feet ashore. A tree about 12 inches in diameter kissed the rub rail about a foot forward of the transom, and brush along the waterline seemed to cushion the remaining hull. Without them, the wind would have blown the boat hard aground.

I managed to slip the eye of a line over the amidships cleat. I then ran it around the tree and wrapped the bitter end back around the cleat. But with the tree continuing to move forward, I did not have time to secure it. I needed to stop the rearward slide, so with a tight grip, I held the line. The aft motion stopped. But waves had built from the west, and the cabin roof's overhang began to slam into the tree. I passed the line to my wife and held a fender between the roof and the tree to stop the damage.

Finally, our arms aching, the wind subsided. Though the anchor dragged, the anchor rode hadn't parted, so I used the windlass to pull our bow seaward. The outboard was free of underbrush, so I applied reverse thrust and began a coordinated side slip from the shore until, finally, we could re-anchor at a safe distance.

Two errors were classic. I failed to pay out enough rode to meet the preferred scope of 7 to 1, and failed to properly set the anchor by powering back hard and digging it in. Also, I should have acknowledged that most storms in our area approach from the south and west, so allowing a large, open western exposure proved to be a serious mistake."

## **MARINE NAVIGATION (PILOTING) CLASS TO START ON 3/4**

Marine Navigation (Piloting) is the first course in the sequence of USPS courses on navigation, covering the basics of coastal navigation. This course focuses on navigation for recreational boaters today and embraces GPS as a primary navigation tool. The students will learn traditional techniques of navigation so the student can find his/her way even if their GPS fails. The course includes many in-class exercises, developing the student's skills through hands-on practice and learning. Eight-Ten classes of two hours each normally are scheduled for presentation of this course. Topics covered include:

- ⇒ Charts and their interpretation
- $\Rightarrow$  Navigation aids and how they point to safe water.
- $\Rightarrow$  Plotting courses and determining direction and distance
- $\Rightarrow$  The mariner's compass and converting between True and Magnetic.
- $\Rightarrow$  Pre-planning safe courses and entering them into the GPS.
- ⇒ Monitoring progress and determining position by both GPS and traditional techinquest such as bearings and dead reckoning






