## AMERICA'S BOATING CLUB-MARCO ISLAND ANNUAL MEETING


## Wednesday, November 10, 2021 5:00 p.m.





Our education program has restarted. The first ABC class had six students, four of whom started the BOAT HANDLING course being taught by Nick Rago. ABC will be held again in December, January, February and March. BOAT HAN-DLING is scheduled again for Feb-



ruary. These two courses form the basis for knowing safe boating. Both are open to members and nonmembers, so register for what interests you and maybe bring a friend.

What's next? November is the start of OFFSHORE NAVIGATION, formerly Junior Navigation, the beginning of celestial navigation. You will learn how to determine your position using a sextant and the sun.

December has several more opportunities to increase your knowledge. INSTRUCTOR DEVELOPMENT is a five session course to become an organization certified instructor. We need more instructors. More instructors will lead to more diversified courses and seminars. CHARTING/GPS is a two session seminar on 14 & 16 December on how to use paper charts and then transfer your skills to an electronic chart plotter.

Do you want to learn more about the whole organization from National through Districts to Squadrons? Join us for the <u>FREE</u> OPERATIONS TRAINING one session seminar on 11 December. You do not need to be an officer for this class.

One person has requested we teach the MARINE ELECTRONICS course which covers both AC and DC circuits. Is anyone else interested? It is a 6 or 7 session course depending on your background. Let me know so we can set up dates and an instructor.

The full education schedule on our web site and on pages 16 and 17 of this issue of the Eagle's Eye, identifies courses and seminars for the winter of 2022. It's never too early to register. On-the-Water training on a vessel you supply and use of the classroom vessel simulator are available for members by contacting me to arrange a time and place. This is an opportunity to put into practice what you learned in the classroom.

What else would you like to learn? Let me know.

Keep learning, go boating and be safe.


