

EDUCATIONAL OFFICER P/D/C Ted Reiss, SN-CN



Congratulation to Jim Addison for passing both the America's Boating Course and Boat Handling course. Congratulations to Chris Frost for passing Electrical Systems. Both did very well.

Education schedule is over until the Fall. We finished up with 7 students in Hurricane Preparedness seminar taught by P/C Rhonda Gloodt and myself and 14 members in the CPR/AED seminar taught by the Marco Island Emergency Medical Services. Look for the new education schedule in September on our website. Before then, let me know what courses, seminars or topics interest you OR how you can help with instructing.

We plan to present the new Marine Navigation course (formerly called Piloting). The beta version was released on 31 January. Gene Burson, Carl Thieme and myself are reviewing it now and will provide comments to national. The new course combines paper chart exercises and electronic charting features using the FREE Open CPN (Chart Plotter Navigation) software. Course leads you through loading the software, downloading the latest marine charts for the whole country, using it to create waypoints/routes and determining expected times/distances for each trip. Tide and current prediction is also included.

America's Boating Channel now has over 70 four to five minute videos on "how to NOT do" and "how TO do" many aspects of safe boating. Personal water craft, navigation, docking, inlets, and life jackets are just a few. An index by topic is now on our website, under the education schedule, which includes how to find the topic of your choice. On 16 April, the America's Boating Channel came alive as an actual internet/streaming channel. Go to YouTube on your computer or on your smart TV. For the first time, I searched by typing America's Boating Channel. There may be another way. Then I hit the channel and all the videos came up sorted by each of the first six years (about 10 per year) plus other videos. Take a look.

Jump Start program is available only for members. This is free, on-the-water training on your boat. Last month three members improved their skills. Let me know if you are interested so we can determine how to improve your skills.

Boating Safety Checklist

Preseason Preparation

- Current registration/documentation papers (including boat trailer) and numbers/decals affixed as required. If you fish, fishing license and fishing gear aboard?
- Review federal, state, and local boating laws and navigation rules
- Join or renew your on-water towing membership
- Maintain boat and systems per manufacturer recommendations and your visual inspection
- Check expiration dates and condition of fire extinguishers and pyrotechnic flares
- Program your VHF radio with your MMSI number
- Schedule your free vessel safety check

Before Departure

- Check weather forecasts, tides, current
- File a float plan with a trusted contact ashore
- Follow safe fueling practices; make sure blower fans are in working order if inboard powered
- Check operation of bilge pump, auto switch, alarms
- Ensure you have appropriate-size life jackets in good repair, and that children wear them. Need a child-sized life jacket? You can often borrow them at a loaner site.
- Brief crew on locations and operation of safety equipment including: life jackets, life sling, or throwable flotation; sound-producing device; flares/visual distress signals; fire extinguishers; and a spare engine cutoff lanyard, if equipped.
- Turn on VHF radio. Show passengers how to select Ch. 16, how to use mic, and when/how to transmit a Mayday. Brief on how/when to use and not use the DSC feature if you have it; ensure the MMSI is programmed in
- Check operation of navigation/running lights
- Ensure that one anchor and rode is ready for immediate use

- Before starting a gasoline inboard engine, run blower for at least 4 minutes
- Attach engine shutoff switch lanyard or device, if fitted

On The Water


- Departing the harbor, store a "go home" waypoint on the GPS, if equipped
- Know the waters you're navigating. Refer to local charts, stay within marked channels, be aware of tides, currents, and areas such as inlets with challenging seas
- Avoid distracted driving, scan the horizon continually for other boats' movements
- Be weather-aware (watch for wind/cloud changes, monitor weather channels)
- While underway, no passengers on the bow, gunwales, or transom
- Monitor fuel consumption and remaining range. Use the "Three-Thirds" rule: one-third outbound, one-third inbound, one-third reserve
- Engines OFF if people are swimming
- Be aware of dangerous CO gasses from engines and/or generators
- Drink plenty of water; wear sunscreen; don't boat under the influence

Should you desire, you can download a copy of this checklist at https://www.boatus.com/expert-advice/expert-advice-archive/2023/april/spring-boating-safety-checklist, have it laminated at an office supply store, and use a dry erase marker to check items off before you head out.

AUDIT COMMITTEE REPORT P/C William J. Hughes Chair, JN

In accordance with the America's Boating Club of Marco Island By Laws, the Audit Committee conducted an audit of the club's Financial Statement and Records for the 2022 calendar year.

The Treasurer presented hard copy records of Deposits, Disbursements, Bank Reconciliations and Inventories for sampling and perusal by the Audit Committee. The records were found to be complete, neat, and accurate.

The auditing Committee, based on its sampling of supporting documents, believes the financial statements and records are presented fairly and that no operational issues were noted.

The committee would like to thank your treasurer, Gerald Cole, for this skill in using the QuickBooks' accounting program and for his making records easily available to the auditing team as well as his work in keeping the records up to date and accurate.

ATON SURVEY UPDATE Lt Cliff Winings, SN

Members of the Coop Charting Committee completed surveys in February and March of Aids to Navigation (ATONs) in waterways from Everglades City to about one mile north of Marco Island. Andy Battaglia, Dave Chaney, Gerald Cole, Ken Deutsch, Kay Deutsch, Chris Frost, Carl Thieme, Jerry Williams and Cliff Winings participated in this work. Survey data and photos were entered into our database that is published on the Aids-to-Navigation page of our website. Data is published both as an Excel file with current and historical data and as a

kml file with current data that can be downloaded and opened in Google Earth. In Google Earth the ATONs are plotted as icons on a satellite image, where each icon indicates the basic condition of the ATON. Clicking on an icon brings up details and a photo of the ATON.



The table below is from the Excel file on our website. It summarizes survey results by ATON owner. Collier County owns and maintains about 2/3 of the ATONs in our area. The United States Coast Guard owns the ATONs in Capri Pass, the channel to Naples, and the main Everglade City channels. The City of Marco Island owns the ATONs in Factory Bay, Collier Bay, Smokehouse Bay and near Hideaway Beach (all but one of the City's ATONs that "Need Repair" are in the Hideaway Beach area). "Private/City" are ATONs in the city limits but owned by a business or other organization.

There are two major issues with ATONs in our area: (1) missing or poor condition and (2) nautical chart position is far from the actual position. The 53 ATONs "Off station > 150 ft and on chart 11430" are shown on the nautical chart more than 150 ft from their actual position; 12 of these are off by > 1000 ft. About 84 % of the ATONs in our area are on the light list and 62% are on the nautical chart. USCG controls the light list. NOAA controls nautical charts and gets ATON position information from the light list.

ATON owners repaired or replaced more than 70 ATONs in the past year. But because of damage by

Hurricane Ian and normal deterioration, the total number that "Need Repair" has increased from 80 to 104. We have issued reports to the city and county with details regarding their ATONs, have scheduled a meeting with the county to review the information, and have reported all discrepancies to USCG. We have also, for the first time, fully participated in the USPS Nautical Reporting program by submitting reports on all surveys to USPS National.




