### BOSUN'S Whistle Bridge Report Cdr Nanette Rivera Lt/C Chris Ricci, S 1/Lt Christopher Frost, AP







MISPS-2024 is off to a great start and promises to be successful and full of opportunities. Squadron members have many opportunities to get involved and leave their fingerprints on how we plan and deliver our principal events this year.

At our Executive Communications meeting (Feb-13th) our Bridge, Executive Committee and Lt/C Officers discussed on how to focus on strengthening our Squadron mission in 2024:

### SQUADRON MISSION:

- A. **EDUCATION**: Boating knowledge & skills
- B. **CIVIC**: Programs & safety practices that enhance our community
- C. **SOCIAL**: A Social calendar of activities that are fun and attracts a growing membership

Delivering excellent programs across these three Mission Anchors requires volunteers with a vision on (i) what can we do differently to enhance our outcomes, and (ii) what must we continue doing as our predecessors have done.

To achieve these aspirations, we will:

- start using more marketing tools to communicate with the Marco boating community.
- begin planning and working on our once-a-year fundraising event throughout the year.

Next month we will launch 3 ad-hoc committees:

- 1. **FUNDRAISING COMMITTEE**: early start on planning and securing donation / partners.
- 2. CIVIC & SAFETY COMMITTEE: integrate communication efforts to the boating community on Marco about programs such as: "Wear-It Campaign", Vessel Inspection & Safety Gear, local waters ATON / PATON inventory status, and Safety / First-Aid & CPR / Situational Awareness
- 3. **IMAGE UPGRADE**: review updating 'The Condo', review the Website for user ease, and

develop a process by which we hear what social programs you prefer and want.

Your contribution to these 3 ad-hoc committees by helping define the Committee Objectives and Outputs will be very helpful. We want to hit the mark 'just right' on the first try – so we deliver efficiently and sunset the committee once objectives are completed. Stay tuned – your voice will be helpful.

Additionally, in February the ATON Survey team led by Cliff Winings with Chris Ricci, Chris Frost, and Andy Battaglia photographed and recorded condition and position data on 64 ATONs in Marco waters – a terrific accomplishment, considering the cold and rainy weather we have been experiencing. We hope to have the final status of our ATON & PATON inventory presented at the Waterways Advisory Committee of the Marco City Council. Perhaps this year we can get a clear path forward on when repairs and replacements will be spearheaded by Marco (City), Coast Guard, and Collier County. We all agree this is an important priority for "safe boating" in our community.

15 of the 16 Vessel Safety Checks completed in February passed their inspections, were logged, and received their stickers. This team of inspectors is led by Jim Addison (a terrific new member of the Squadron who joined in 2023). Jim's team has several more VSC's upcoming. All members should remember to update their VSC's and get their sticker.

We welcomed Joe Navin and Geoff & Kathie Fahringer as new members this February. And, thanks to Peggy & Ted Reiss and Jane Orsulak (our publishing editor) our **2024 Roster and Fleet List booklet** was printed and is available to our members (Peggy got Joe Navin and the Fahringer's into the roster just in time before it went to the printers). Like last year it includes not only each member's picture and contact information, but the booklet also lists a month-by-month Activities & Events detail program for 2024. It is an essential guide to keep handy.

Chris Frost, our Bridge Administrative Officer, diligently put together an active monthly calendar in the **2024 Roster and Fleet List** booklet which lists over 100 events / meetings / boating activities and land-based social lunches / dinners / cocktail-hours for us to get together during 2024.

On Friday Feb-16th we had an excellent Fish-Fry

dinner at Marco Island Residents Beach under one of the Tiki-Huts close to the Paradise Grill concession The Marco Island Stand truly makes an excellent fried grouper dinner (you can buy wine or beer or bring your own). 16 squadron members and guests including five new members joined the Squadron event (see photo on front page). The weather was perfect, come join us at the next event! In March we have breakfast at Mango's on Saturday, March 9th. Our Dinner Meeting is Wednesday March 13th (sign-up through Dorothy Harkness) -the presentation is on kayaking, paddle board and canoe safety and their interaction on the water with larger vessels. Mid-March we sponsor the beach cleanup at South Beach on March 16th at 0800! 

## EDUCATIONAL OFFICER P/D/C Ted Reiss, SN-CN



March brings an end to the Winter Education schedule of courses and seminars. Courses still ongoing are: Marine Navigation, Marine Electrical Systems, Celestial Navigation and America's Boating Course. March seminars are: Charting/GPS, how to use

both a paper chart and an electronic chart plotter; Hurricane Preparedness, what you can do to reduce potential damage to your boat; and Emergencies on Board, how to deal with possibly bad situations. As always, Jump Start, the FREE on-the-water, one-onone training program is available at any time for members, on their boat or one they rent. And the Boat Around Marco is scheduled for March 20th starting at 1030 in the cove near Rose Marina. This is an opportunity to learn where the deep water is and much more all the way around the island (weather permitting). 

### SAFETY OFFICER Goeff Fahringer



Our New Safety Officer, Geoff Fahringer, is the head instructor of a HSI Medic First Aid training center located here in Collier County Florida. Geoff is certified

with HSI Medic First Aid to teach adult first aid, pediatric first aid, CPR/AED all ages, wilderness first aid, blood borne pathogens, child and babysitting safety, use and administration of Epinephrine auto injectors, oxygen, advanced bleeding control and high-performance CPR.

Geoff has taught both public safety diving classes and rescue swimmer classes to both fire departments as well as law enforcement agencies up to instructor level. And for the past 18 years, he taught CPR/AED and first aid classes to both businesses as well as public groups, boating groups, gun clubs and more. Geoff, a retired law enforcement officer with the Collier County Sheriff's Office, was also the main instructor for CPR/AED and tactical first aid for the Sheriff's Office; teaching Deputy re-certifications along with other instructors for the sheriff's office.

### MAN OVERBOARD DRILLS

Several years ago, I was on a dive boat about a mile off Pompano Beach with a bunch of students from Naples on the way to teach wreck diving when my dive master yelled "there is someone in the water". We were heading southeast and off our starboard side a couple of hundred yards away there was a diver in the water. The diver was in about 110' feet of water and had been blown off the Lucky Lady wreck by the current. By the time he came up to the surface, he was quite far from the dive boat that was moored at the wreck site. This was a man in his 20's with dark hair and to make matters even worse, in a black wet suit. He looked like a coconut in the water, and I was amazed that with 18 people on our dive boat, only one person had been looking at just the right place in the ocean at just the right time.

This got me thinking about man overboard drills and the need to know what to do from training to make a save BEFORE the event actually happens. People fall off boats, even something as large as a cruise ship.

Here is suggestion -- the next time you're out on a cruise, a day cruise or just out enjoying the water and you're bored, your crew or your guests are bored, or you just have some extra time, think about performing a drill that can save a life. Man overboard drills are actually fun and add a bit of excitement and camaraderie to the day. So, how do we do one? Simply let the passengers know that you are going to do a man overboard drill and discuss ahead of time what everyone can expect and discuss different roles. Then when you're ready, simply throw something overboard that floats and is visible, (like a red throwable foam cushion) and go get it!

### MAN OVERBOARD – WHAT TO DO?

Man overboard is a situation where someone from the crew of the ship falls out at sea from the ship. This can happen in circumstances like bad weather, accidents, or even negligence.

The initial and early sighting of the fallen crew member plays a vital role in increasing the percentage of saving his/her life. The actions for a MOB (Man Overboard) or PIW (person in water) are extremely urgent and must be taken without any delay to save the life of the person who has fallen overboard.

When a man is overboard, the next steps are crucial:

- Crew members shout 'man overboard' until the entire crew is aware of the situation.
- Press the MOB button on the GPS.
- Release or throw the lifebuoy to the MOB.
- Assign a crew member to point at the MOB in the water. Continue to do this the entire time; don't lose sight of the MOB.
- Turn the boat 180° back to the MOB.
- Prepare a throwing line. A throwing line in a canvas bag attached to a float-able seat cushion is a perfect accessory to always have available. I will be glad to show you mine.
- The skipper will bring the boat alongside the MOB, with the boat pointing into the wind and the propeller stopped.
- Get a line to the MOB and get them aboard.

This last part is very important, how do you get your MOB back on board? Some of our larger boats have a deck platform in the back of the boat, some don't. If you must lift a wet and exhausted person onto your boat that needs to be thought out ahead of time as that can be the most challenging part of the recovery.

Crowdsourcing is the collective efforts of a community to gather data. Anyone enthusiastic about the ocean can participate in collecting data about our seafloor. Bathymetry focuses on measuring and mapping the topography of the ocean floor. It is the study of underwater depths, contours and features, providing crucial insights into seafloor formations such as mountains, canyons and ridges.
