#### Marco Island Sail & Power Squadron (MISPS) is becoming a leader in the Marco Island Boating Community

As the 2024 Commander of the MISPS, I view building the skills of the boating community in <u>Tactical First-Aid CPR/AED</u> as *a civic duty*. Our MISPS marketing committee and key bridge leaders have invited the Marco Island Boating Community to form a coalition that emphasizes training that will save lives when minutes count.

Our goal is to build a critical number of Marco's population into individuals who are skilled in resuscitation and who can confidently assume situational leadership, when decision making and acting makes a difference to someone's life. This will be the first "line of defense" **before** EMS arrives.

The national average **survival** rate for sudden cardiac arrest (SCA) in the U.S. remains very low, generally around 5-10%. For each additional minute a person is in cardiac arrest, there is a 10% decrease in the chance for survival.

In King County, Washington, one small community north of Seattle decided to focus on making Automated External Defibrillators (AED) available throughout the town. They combined AED availability with skilled residents and improved survival rates to as high as 40-60%. That is remarkable!

Members of The Marco Island Power Squadron, the US Coast Guard Auxiliary, the Marco Island Yacht Club, the Marco Island Cruise Club, and other Boating enthusiasts such as the Kayaking Club have come together to develop skills in first aid and awareness of how to improve personal safety. The training is hands-on and tactical, using a dummy and with a live Automated External Defibrillator (AED).

These skills can be equally applied to stabilize a

guest who injures himself in your boat during a Sunday outing, or a stranger who stops breathing and collapses in the parking lot outside the Publix supermarket. What we must learn to do is lead at the scene and act: call 911, begin compressions, and secure and deploy a nearby AED. It takes confidence to lead a team of bystanders in these circumstances.

Our boating community shares a culture of camaraderie, enjoyment of boating, and a focus on building safe boating and navigation skills. We believe many of our members likely have an interest in strengthening and refreshing their personal safety and first aid skills. Classes of 20-students with interests in learning how to resuscitate or stabilize injuries (bleeding, bone fractures, heart attacks, strokes, drowning, and more) have been offered at our Squadron condo in April and May.

The skills learned may help you save a life, but at a minimum it will give you confidence to help a "mate" find comfort while waiting for outside 911 emergency help to arrive. These skilled individuals become assets for the community.

Geoff Fahringer, our Squadron Safety Officer, and class instructor calls us trained "Sheep Dogs" (come to one of the next classes offered and learn how/why you become community Sheep Dogs). Sheep dogs guard the sheep.

In April Marco's Boating Community came together and launched the first of many classes to come. All classes are open to the public and are held at the Squadron learning center. **Classes are free**, and we encourage you to sign-up and invite friends and neighbors to attend – we want a 'critical mass' of Marco Residents to become skilled in life saving techniques.



A second set of classes, **Situational Awareness**, is meant to improve anticipation skills; Capt. Fahringer says: "Marco Island is safe, but Situational Awareness becomes important when you go across the bridge, and you leave paradise! The rest of

Florida is not the safe enclave that Marco is."

The situational training touches on common sense precautions that we can take, such as: having a plan; analyzing your environment; identifying threats, trusting your instincts and how to avoid being a victim. For example: if you are in the mall and there is an active shooter, how can you improve your chances to make it out safely?

During May, Marco's Safe Boating Month, our squadron was recognized by the Marco Island City Council with a proclamation for the 'Wear-It Campaign.' Remember, when on the water, increase your personal safety and <u>role-model for others</u> by wearing a comfortable self-inflatable life jacket, no excuses!

After taking these classes it becomes our duty to be safe and not add to the statistics.



## **SAFETY OFFICER Goeff Fahringer**



### HOW "SHIP-SHAPE" ARE YOU?

As boaters and members of the Power Squadron, we find ourselves at times being more physically active

than say belonging to the local chess club. Now don't get me wrong, I like playing chess. But I have never in the middle of a chess game wondered if my lower back was going to give me trouble as I try for checkmate:-)

Luckily there are a few tools we can incorporate into both our day-to-day lives as well as the time we spend on our boats.

I am talking about using resistance bands and kettle balls or dumbbells to help us stay physically fit.

**RESISTANCE BANDS.** When we talk about workout equipment, nothing is more portable and yet can work every muscle from head to toe than resistance bands. Resistance bands use oppositional forces to train your muscles. Basically, the band will feel heavier and give more resistance the more you pull on it. You can also choose the intensity and level of your workout by just choosing different thickness of bands or simply moving the band to different tension points on your body.

I bought my bands at <a href="www.ironwoodyfitness.com">www.ironwoodyfitness.com</a>. Go to this site to both see the wide variety of bands and workout tips.

**KETTLE BALLS OR DUMBBELLS**. A small set of kettle-balls or dumb-bells, say 5lb, 10lb and 15lb or 20lb, is all you need to do basic exercises like curls



for your arms, chest presses or check out the goblet squat for the legs and butt. I prefer kettle-balls over dumb-bells as the handle on the kettle ball gives you a wider range of exercises; like the Russian kettle-ball swing to build those lower back muscles. I have attached a couple of posters you can use to see a wide range of exercises. Remember, being "ship shape" also means staying in shape!
