EDUCATIONAL OFFICER P/D/C Ted Reiss, SN-CN



Marco squadron has a new Fall and Winter education program. America's Boating Course (ABC) begins on October 10th and Boat Handling (BH) starts on October 28th. Are you ready to continue learning? ABC is the first course related to boat safety and is aimed

at new boaters. We start with the front of the boat called the bow and continue with safety equipment, rules of the road, navigation buoys and lights, communication equipment, personal water craft operation, emergencies, trailering, knots and lines plus much more. Passing this course entitles you to the Florida Safe Boating Identification Card. BH continues the material from ABC and goes into much more depth. This course might be the first course for students with some boating background.

Next we have the Marine Navigation course – how to get from here to there using charts, compasses, and electronic global positioning systems and computers. Then we have Marine Electrical systems – basic electronics related to onboard power, both 12 volt batteries and 110 volt alternating current similar to your household power.

A renamed, free seminar for members only is: What is the Organization. This seminar is for newer members and the almost installed, newly elected individuals. We address the total organization, National, District and Squadron, the role of each, how to communicate to each and our purpose. Event is on 14 December starting at 9 AM.

Two-hour, no test seminars address the following topics. For many couples, only one person is comfortable running the boat. What happens when that person in unable to do so? Partner in Command seminar is aimed at couples to help them share the fun and skills needed to safely operate their boat. Charting and GPS seminars review paper charts and electronic charts. What information is available and how can that information help us navigate. Anchoring seminar focuses on the total package from how to select the proper anchor, where to anchor, how to set the anchor and how to retrieve it. Hurricane Preparedness discusses the alternatives on

how to increase the safety of your boat during hurricanes – something that could occur on Marco. Emergencies on the Water gives you incite into what to do when things like bad weather, engine failures, illness, collisions, and much more suddenly impact your safety.

On-the-water training is available for free for our members. We offer this training on your boat (or a boat you rent) basically on a one-on-one basis. We call this program Jump Start. What better way to improve new skills!

Road Rage

If you're looking for one tip on how NOT to become a victim of road rage well, here you go. STAY OUT OF THE LEFT LANE! Thank you and good night. OK it's not quite that easy, but that is an important one -- more on that later.

The Florida Department of highway safety and motor vehicles describes road rage as: Road Rage is violent or visibly angry behavior by a driver which can result in crashes or other incidents on roadways. Signs include: ◆ sudden acceleration or braking, ◆ following too closely; ◆ cutting off other drivers; ◆ preventing other vehicles from merging into your lane; ◆ excessively hitting the horn or flashing headlights; ◆ shouting obscenities or threats; ◆ making obscene hand gestures; ◆ intentionally causing a crash; ◆ getting out of a vehicle in an attempt to start a confrontation; ◆ using a weapon or threatening to use a weapon; and/or ◆ throwing objects from the vehicle.

If another driver is threatening you or intentionally driving dangerously around you, remain calm and try to put as much distance between you and them as possible. Slow down and let them pass. Do not make eye contact; do not make obscene gestures. If you need help, call *FHP (*347) or 911

- In 2023, 92% witnessed an act of road rage in the past year. (The Zebra)
- A total of 12,610 injuries and 218 murders have

- been attributed to road rage over a seven-year period in the United States (Safe Motorist).
- In 2022, someone was shot and killed in a road rage incident every 16 hours. (Everytown Research)
- 66% of traffic fatalities are caused by aggressive driving. (NHTSA)
- Road rage has been responsible for about 300 deaths since 2013. (NHTSA)
- 30 murders annually are linked to road rage. (American Psychological Association)
- 50% of drivers respond to the careless acts of other drivers with aggressive behavior themselves. (American Psychology Association)
- 94% of traffic accidents are caused by driver error. (NPR)
- 37% of aggressive driving incidents involve a firearm. (AutoVantage Club)
- 500% increase in reported cases of road rage over the last 10 years. (CNN)

A report in FORBES Advisor stated,

- In 2023-2024 41% of drivers witnessed an act of road rage, 32% experienced road rage from another driver and 22% felt road rage themselves.
- Among the drivers we surveyed, the top reasons cited for feeling road rage include:
 - Another driver was driving badly (40%)
 - Another driver was driving aggressively (38%)
 - Another driver cut me off (31%)
 - I was already feeling stressed (29%)
 - Another driver was tailgating me (27%)

Often the question comes up, just how serious is road rage and aggressive driving in our area and what are the local law enforcement agencies doing to combat road rage? I reached out to Collier County Sheriff's Office Sergeant Scott Kaplin who oversees the Sheriff's Special Operations Division Motor Squad, traffic enforcement guys to the rest of us. I asked Scott to give us some comments on the subject.

1. Sgt Kaplan, just how serious are road rage incidents and aggressive drivers in Collier County?

Road rage and aggressive driving are serious concerns in Collier County, as they can lead to dangerous situations on the road. These incidents can escalate quickly, leading to accidents, injuries, or even confrontations.

2. What does the Collier County Sheriff's Office do

to combat aggressive drivers and road rage incidents?

The Collier County Sheriff's Office actively works to reduce aggressive driving and road rage through a combination of enforcement, education, and public awareness. CCSO conducts increased patrols, particularly in high-traffic areas, to deter reckless behavior. The Safety Traffic Enforcement Bureau (STEB) utilizes motorcycles and unmarked vehicles to conduct targeted operations aimed at reducing dangerous driving.

3. What should people do if they observe aggressive drivers or a road rage incident? Who should they call? Is this a 911 call or should they call the non-emergency number?

If someone witnesses a road rage incident that poses an immediate threat to safety call 911. Do not follow the vehicle. For less urgent cases where there's no immediate danger, they can contact our non-emergency line 239-252-9300.

4. What can drivers do to not become a victim of road rage? In my power point presentation, one of the big recommendations is to stop hanging out in the left lane unless you're passing another car or turning left. Your thoughts on left lane drivers and any other suggestions like don't gesture at someone who cuts you off etc.?

Remain calm and avoid engaging with aggressive drivers.

- Avoid using gestures, honking excessively, or driving too closely to another vehicle.
- Give aggressive drivers plenty of space and avoid making eye contact.
- If someone is driving aggressively, it's best to safely change lanes or slow down to let them pass.
- 5. What can a driver do IF they become a victim of road rage? One of the things I recommend in my power point is not to engage the road rage suspect in any way, drive into a public parking lot like a Racetrack gas station, pull up to the front door, DON'T get out of the car, just honk the car horn over and over to attract witnesses and maybe help.
 - Stay calm
 - Do not stop to confront the other driver.
 - Drive to a public, safe location if possible
 - Call 911 immediately if the aggressive driver

poses an immediate threat or is following you.

- Report the incident to law enforcement and provide as many details as possible to the dispatcher. Example:
 - vehicle's description
 - license plate
 - driver description if possible
 - direction of travel.

So, lets discuss hanging out in that left lane. In my discussions, I talk about not becoming a target or the trigger to an attack. Regarding aggressive drivers, you should avoid inadvertently becoming the trigger to someone's rage. The example I use is the driver speeding up behind you just got chewed out by his boss, his wife is leaving him, his girlfriend is mad at him, his dog bit him, he is out of beer and his tires are bald AND you have the audacity to be driving the speed limit in the left (passing) lane. See my point? Stay out of the left lane -- speeding and just bad drivers are not in your purview to "teach a lesson to" by setting up a rolling roadblock.

Something else to ponder, you do not need a permit of any kind to have a firearm in a vehicle in Florida. I bring up this point NOT because this is either a good thing or a bad thing. I mention it because potentially every car on the road around you has a gun in it, and you are giving an obscene gesture, "brake checking" or cutting off a car with a gun in it! Here are some last points -- food for thought,

- Now is the time to be polite.
- It's not the grand prix, you're not going to win anything by being first over the line.
- You might be right BUT is it really worth it?
- Stay in the right lane until you need to pass or turn left, DON'T BE A TRIGGER!
- Give the guy in front room. Yes, someone will cut in, let them (see #2 above).
- Ignore the universal hand signal, horn honking and "the look", DON'T respond in kind.
- If you feel threatened call 911, pull into a public area. Stay in your car and honk the horn (A LOT) to get attention.

Stay safe and as Sergeant Kaplin stated and I agree with wholeheartedly, DON'T HESITATE TO CALL 911 if you suspect a crime is occurring, and just to add to that any suspected medical emergency or suspicious incident.



Our Boating Season will be in full swing soon, which makes the topic of our safety message today even more urgent — Towed Sports Safety. As our waterways become more crowded, it is vital to identify and implement important measures for safely water skiing, wake boarding, knee boarding, wake surfing, and tubing. These measures are presented in the "Towed Sports Safety" video where viewers learn about proper equipment selection and preparing to tow a person. Also featured are tips for operating underway.

Invite your friends and neighbors to watch, like and subscribe to America's Boating Channel on YouTube as a fun and educational introduction to what our organization has to offer. This video and more also are available via the America's Boating Channel free on-demand app on Apple TV, Roku or FireTV.




